



WRWSD Board of Trustees Meeting – Mon., May 22, 2017

President Jim Bridges called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

Roll Call: Present: Beard, Beresford, Bridges, Buskey, LaPlante, Mgr. Cahall. and Plant Supt. Culver Absent: Purdin (ex.) and Redick (ex.)

Minutes: A motion was made by Beard and seconded by Beresford to approve the minutes of the May 13th Saturday meeting as distributed via email. A yea/may vote was taken and the motion. passed unanimously.

President's Report (Jim Bridges): no report

Treasurer's Report (John Boskey): Buskey reported how the District's sever and water rates compare to the sewer and water rates of about sixty communities in southwestern Ohio which were shared in the 2017 survey done by the city of Oakwood, OH. The Trustees discussed possibly gathering and comparing information about rates of other companies in Brown Co. and the counties which surround it.

Report from the Manager (Paul Cahall):

- All of the 2016 financial records and related paperwork, including the year-end financial, are • ready to be picked up on May 23rd for the State of Ohio's annual audit.
- The payment to reconcile the 2016 services contract between the WRWSD and the WPOA. was made to the District by the WPOA.
- Informational sessions for all employees participating in the 401K plan benefit being offered. by the WPOA and the WRWSD will be held on June 14th and 15th.
- Five grinder pumps were purchased. The Manager is aware of four more house permit requests. An adjustment will need to be made to the 2017 WRWSD budget.
- The removal of sindge from the sewer plant will begin within the next month or so. The • WPOA will provide one tandem truck and driver to assist in this project.
- The staff of the WRWSD is 'chasing down' a significant water leak on Atoka Cove which. will involve driveway and road repairs with which the WPOA will assist.
- A new water meter for the pool was ordered in late 2016. A meter was just shipped today! Plant Supt. Colver contacted a different company from which to purchase the meter after realizing the former company's representatives were not well informed.
- Mgr. Caball, Plant Supt. Culver and Clerk Bundy met to discuss and revise the Long Range. 5-year Capital Improvement plan/maintenance effort for 2017. Mgr. Caball will now review the document with Treasurer Buskey before presenting it to the Trustees.

- There will be no change in the cost for the employee life insurance benefit this year. However, the agent plans to do a competitive bid in hopes of getting a better cost.
- The 'summer help' employee began working today.
- The printer/copier has finally been delivered and installed!
- After further discussion about how to limit the liability of an 'attractive misance', the back-up lake, the Trustees directed the Manager to install more signage and a gate. The possibility of fencing the upland reservoir was also discussed as equipment has been stolen.

Adjournment: At 7:35 pm a motion to adjourn the meeting was made by LaPlante and seconded by Beresford. All were in favor and the meeting was adjourned.



WRWSD Board of Trustees Meeting - Sat., June 10, 2017

President Jim Bridges called the meeting to order at 9:30 a.m.

Roll Call: Present: Beresford, Bridges, Buskey, LaPlante, Purdin, Redick & Mgr. Cahall

Absent Beard (ex.)

Minutes: A motion was made by Purdin and seconded by Bereaford to approve the minutes of the May 22nd workshop meeting as read. A yea/nay vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.

President's Report (Jim Bridges): Bridges noted that the staff has been busy installing new taps!

Treasurer's Report (John Buskey):

- WRWSD income and expenses, at 42% through the year, are meeting goals as expected. Income is at 56% of the total anticipated for the year and the water and sewer expenses are at 36%. Total expenses are at 32%.
- The District budgeted for eight new water and sewer taps in 2017. This goal has already been reached this year, which is a significant difference from 2016. Requests for more new house permits, and thus taps, are anticipated.
- Several new grinder pumps were purchased at a cost of about \$17K.
- The WRWSD continues to be 'in good shape' financially.

Manager's Report (Paul Cahall):

- The auditors with the State of Ohio now perform the annual audit of the WRWSD's financial reports at their location rather than on site.
- The new construction is keeping the staff very busy.
- Life insurance for WPOA and WRWSD employees, which is less expensive with more coverage, has been obtained. Employees will also be offered the opportunity to purchase dental insurance (at no cost to the WRWSD).

Board Member Concerns: none

Membership Concerns:

*<u>Charles Porter</u> (Lot #2047): Forter was told, in answer to his question, that the water availability fees go directly into the WRWSD's water reserve fund for maintenance, repairs, etc.

In response to Porter's concerns about possible pesticide/herbicide contamination of Lake Waynoka's drinking water he was told that the carbon filter system was installed several years ago to prevent such contamination. Water sample testing is done by both the District and the Ohio EPA on a regular basis.

Adjournment: The motion to adjourn was then made by Purdin and seconded by Beresford. All were in favor and the meeting was adjourned at 9:43 am.







LAKE WAYNOKA BASS TOURNAMENT RULES

- 1. Interpretation of the following rules shall be the sole responsibility of the tournament directors.
- 2. Any style of boat may be used (canoe, pontoon, etc.) if the following criteria is met:
 - a. Owned by a member in good standing and Lake Waynoka registered for the current year with attached sticker.
 - b. Has an operating aerated live well. No stringers or baskets are permitted. Live wells must be checked by a tournament official prior to tournament start time.
 - c. Is covered by a minimum of \$100,000 liability insurance. By payment of entry fees the boat owner is certifying they have insurance coverage.
- 3. The Lake Committee reserves the right at their sole discretion to exclude any angler from participation.
- 4. This is a Team event with a maximum of two anglers per boat. Entrants may launch anywhere, but must be at tournament headquarters thirty (30) minutes prior to the scheduled take off time.
- 5. Only Largemouth, Smallmouth and Spotted bass will be eligible. A total of five (5) fish, twelve (12) inches or longer may be weighed per boat. Weight in pounds and ounces will determine winners. In the event of ties in weight, order of finish will be determined by (a) the boat having the most fish (b) the largest fish (c) flip of a coin.
- 6. Only five (5) bass can be in the team's possession at any time. Culling must be done immediately. No undersized bass may be kept at any time. All fish must be released after being weighed.
- 7. Bass must touch the 12" line with mouth closed on the official tournament measurement board. Any dead bass brought to the scales will <u>NOT</u> be weighed or counted. A one (1) pound penalty will be charged for each fish less than twelve (12) inches weighed in. Courtesy board provided.
- 8. All bass must be brought to the weigh in scales before the boat is removed from the lake. No bass will be weighed if brought to the weigh in scales from a trailered boat.
- 9. Life jackets must be on and zipped at all times when the outboard engine is running. The boat operator must have the kill switch cord attached to their life jacket at all times the engine is running.
- 10. <u>OBEY</u> all no wake markers—idle speed only in these areas. Safe boating conduct is a must. All WPOA Rules & Regulations and State boating regulations will be strictly adhered to, subject to disqualification.
- 11. All participants are expected to exercise good sportsmanship and courtesy, including maintaining at least 50 yards between participating boats.
- 12. The entire lake becomes no wake at dark (indicated by the automatic lights on the dam). Both bow and stern lights must be in good working condition and must be turned on from sunset to sunrise.
- 13. No team member can depart from their boat at anytime during tournament hours unless returning to tournament headquarters. (Marina dock).
- 14. Intoxication will not be tolerated. Alcoholic beverages and non-medically necessary drugs are not permitted in the boat.
- 15. Only artificial lures may be used during the tournament. No trolling is permitted.
- 16. Lake Waynoka is <u>OFF LIMITS</u> for fishing to all tournament participants 24 hours prior to the scheduled tournament start time. Violation of this rule will result in automatic disqualification.
- 17. Team number tokens must be hung back on the display board by team members only at or before the official time has been reached to end the competition. Late arrivals will be penalized 1 pound per minute for each minute they are late. Five minutes late will disqualify a team's complete weight for the tournament.
- 18. No underwater cameras will be permitted during the tournament.
- 19. All protests must be lodged with the tournament director **PRIOR** to any announcement of payouts.

ANY VIOLATION OF THE ABOVE RULES WILL DISQUALIFY A TEAM'S WEIGHT


