#### WPOA Board of Trustees Saturday Meeting – 9/14/19

- \*\*The deadline for submission of information for the monthly newsletter and other media releases is the Tuesday following the WPOA meeting at 4pm. The Office staff appreciates the cooperation of all of the clubs to share the events and activities held at Lake Waynoka.

President Prescilla Redick called the meeting to order at 10am.

President Redick led those present in the Lord's Prayer followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

Roll Call: Present: Beard, Crank, Ellis, Johnson, McDulin, Purdin, Redick, Robinson, Taylor, Mgr. Cahall

**Minutes:** McDulin made a motion and Taylor seconded to approve the 8/10/19 minutes as printed in the newsletter. A yea/nay vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.

President's Report (Prescilla Redick): None

#### **Treasurer's Report (Vernon Taylor):**

#### **Operating funds**

- The total operating <u>income</u> for the month of August was \$115,000.00.
- The total operating <u>expense</u> for the month of August was \$219,000.00 with no unexpected expenses.
- ♦ The operating fund <u>balance</u> at the end of August was \$659,467.39.
- ♦ The operating <u>income</u> for the year at the end of August as \$1,796,000.00 and that is 84% of the plan for 2019. The expected income at the end of August was 84% so the WPOA is right on budget.
- The operating <u>expense</u> for the year at the end of August was \$1,463,000.00 and that is 70% of the plan for 2019. The expected expense was 70% so we are right on budget.

#### **Allocated Assessment Funds**

- ◆ The income for allocated operating assessments in August was \$14,000.00.

  Assessment account expenditures in August totaled \$111,000.00 almost all from road repair.
- ♦ The balance of all allocated assessment accounts at the end of August was \$252,932.82.

#### **Invested Funds**

• Invested reserves at the end of August totaled \$451,391.01.

\*Total cash on hand at the end of July was \$1,363,791.22.

#### Manager's Report (Paul Cahall):

- Mowing operations are right on time and we will have no trouble making it around 3 full times. I expect to secure mowing in the fields around the end of the month.
- We are working on the logistics of replacing the docks at Little Turtle over the winter. This is a really big and challenging job.
- We will have a booth again this year at the Brown County Fair so stop by and say hello while you are enjoying the fair.
- Dredging operations will continue until we are complete with the cove they are working on. This will enable us to start our last cove next year. Hopefully by the end of next year we will have been around the lake one time.
- There will be some road work being done this month at the front gate. The work should only take one day so watch for the changing traffic pattern during this work.
- Shoreline protection letters were sent out this month. If you got one of these letters and feel it was sent to you in error, let me know and I will come out and re-inspect your shore line. This is the year we take the lake down several feet for shoreline and dock work. Start making your plans now.
- At the Recreation Center, the indoor pool was closed for a couple of days for cleaning and replacement of a failed ventilation fan. The outdoor pools are being prepared for the winter and we will be replacing the winter cover on the adult pool.
- ♦ I will be attending the fall OLCA meeting at Lake Cable the 18<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> of September. These meetings are a great opportunity for Lake Communities to share ideas and solutions.
- We will be tearing out the Little Turtle docks within the month. If you dock your boat there, please remove it asap.
- ♦ The lake valve will be opened in early November so plan accordingly to remove your boat. We will be dropping the lake 5-7 feet this year, so it is a great year to get dock repairs completed and/or new docks put in.
- The Board approved a 50<sup>th</sup> year emblem that the employees will be wearing. The clubs can work with Gina Dash if they'd like to use the emblem on any of their things or are free to make their own.

Lake Advisory (Michael LaPlante): No report

Long Range Planning (Pete Levermore): A member of the Long Range Planning Committee (LRPC) will meet with the Lake Manager this month to discuss the committee's 5-year long range plan, comparing it with the 30, 5 & one year assessments and start making the necessary adjustments to the near term assessments. In addition, the LRPC will get guidance on what the Lake Manager needs to prepare for the assessment ballot as well as invite him to the next LRPC meeting. The LRPC reviewed a sub-committee's data for Walking Trail Development plan alternatives. This data will be presented to the WPOA Board at their September workshop. It was also agreed that several members will start research on playground recommendations that will be presented to the Board in a similar fashion in coming months. LRPC asked for topic areas of interest to the Board that can be used in future survey monkey questions. Please don't hesitate to contact the LRPC if any questions.

The front runner of the walking path would be around the rec center, ball fields and Little Turtle. This location offers access to restrooms, water, changing rooms, ect. The path would be .93 miles long with a cost of \$31,000. This will be discussed at the budget meeting in October. Further information will be posted on the Lake Waynoka website.

Regulations (John Buskey): The Committee did not meet in August. Chair was asked to edit current Rules & Regulations, Vol. 1, to add all appropriate motions since March 2017. This work is in progress. Members are invited to suggest changes to the Restrictive Covenants by contacting the Committee Co-chairs. Please submit any suggestions in writing if possible.

#### **Unfinished Business:**

- ◆ Election Timeline: Monday, Sept. 30<sup>th</sup> Candidate applications must be received at office by 4pm; Tuesday, Oct. 8<sup>th</sup> Election materials needed for the newsletter delivered to office and election materials needed for mailing delivered to the printer; Saturday, Oct. 12<sup>th</sup> Meet and Greet candidate event after the WPOA monthly meeting; Monday, Oct. 21<sup>st</sup> List and labels of eligible voters printed by office; Friday, Oct 25<sup>th</sup> Ballots mailed to voters by this date; Monday, Dec 2<sup>nd</sup> Returned ballots must be received at office by 4pm (*ballots received after this time*, *even if they are postmarked Dec.* 2<sup>nd</sup>, will NOT be accepted); Friday, Dec. 6<sup>th</sup> Votes counted by this date.
- The Rec Center will be available for a shelter in place by the Red Cross, if needed.
- ♦ There are discrepancies concerning port-a-lets, trash burning, dumpsters, ect. Steve VonWahlde and John Buskey will be presenting updated materials to the Board at the next workshop so information will be correct in all Lake Waynoka publications.

#### **New Business:**

- ♦ BYOBs were requested for the Lodge on Oct. 12<sup>th</sup> for a WaterSports Oktoberfest celebration, the Rec Center on Oct. 12 for the Needy Children's Christmas Dinner and the Lodge on Oct. 19 for a wedding. A motion was made by Taylor and seconded by McDulin to approve the requests. A yea/nay vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.
- ♦ It was proposed to officially change the Red Hat Ladies name to the WD50s. A yea/nay vote was taken and it was approved unanimously.
- Mgr. Cahall will be in Canton, Ohio Wednesday and Thursday for the OCLA meeting at Lake Cable. Mgr. Cahall is also a member of the Board for the OCLA. He hopes to receive good information and ideas to bring back to the Board.
- ♦ There was an extremely negative letter posted in the Rec Center. Security is reviewing camera footage to identify the perpetrator and charges may be filed. Trustee Ellis implored everyone to come forward to the Board or Lake Manager to discuss complaints so we can try to work them out in a civilized fashion.

#### **Motions and Resolutions:**

- A motion was made by Beard and seconded by Crank to censure Donna Wyatt based upon her violation of Robert's Rules and her use of profanity during the past meeting. In addition, there is a violation of Motion #269 which addresses employee harassment regulations which includes elected officials. *Please see the Yellow Book for more information and the penalties associated with violation of this regulation.* Discussion: Trustee Purdin stated that we have all said or done things that we regret and we should take that into consideration. A question was asked about censuring someone. Trustee Beard explained that a censure is an official disapproval or reprimand of behavior. Doris Kitchen expressed she understands Mrs. Wyatt's frustration. A yea/nay vote was taken and the motion passed with 7 yeas and 2 nays (Purdin and Robinson).
- ♦ A motion was made by Taylor and seconded by Ellis to approve the timeline for the WPOA and WRWSD election. A yea/nay vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously

She believes that she was removed from the Board illegally and is fighting it in court. She advocates a Town Hall meeting.
- Mike Woods (273) Asked if the WPOA purchased a new vehicle. Mgr. Cahall stated no.
- ♦ Sandy Beard (405) Sandy read a beautiful letter thanking everyone for their outpouring of love and support during a boating accident involving their grandchildren. This is a great community.
- ♦ **Ginny Tatman (2635)** Survey Monkey should not be used for total voting.

**Adjournment:** The motion to adjourn was made by Taylor and seconded by Ellis. A yea/nay vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously. The meeting was adjourned at 10:55am.

#### WRWSD Board of Trustees Monday Meeting – 8/26/19

President Bridges called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm.

**Roll Call:** Present: Beard, Bridges, Buskey, Hagen, LaPlante, Levermore, Redick, Mgr. Cahall, Supt. Culver **Minutes:** A motion was made by Redick and seconded by Beard to approve the 7/13/19 and 8/10/19 minutes as emailed. A yea/nay vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.

#### President's Report (Jim Bridges): None

<u>Treasurer's Report (John Buskey):</u> Treasurer Buskey discussed the proposed adjustments for the 2019 budget (Motion# 2019-11) and sending Kay Bundy for Public Records training (Motion# 2019-12). *See Motions and Resolutions below* 

#### Manager and Plant Superintendent Report (Paul Cahall & Supt. Culver):

- ◆ Master Meter update Representatives from Master Meter and Ferguson were on site with Supt. Culver to evaluate our system and present some changes to push us to 98% accuracy. Roughly 18-21 meters are still not reporting.
- ♦ New construction There have been many requests for water and sewer tap installation. The WRWSD staff is staying up to date with these requests.
- ◆ EPA Supt. Culver has filled out an application with the EPA for pesticide use. He is still waiting on directions/ solutions from the EPA concerning the lagoon.
- ♦ Sewer Plant Meter The meter is on site and waiting to be installed.
- Frontier is alleging that their lines were damaged during water and sewer tap installation on Comanche.
- Bryer internet has been installed at the WRWSD plant. We are hoping to get all of the WPOA buildings connected with increased internet speed.
- ♦ Lot 2461 Mgr. Cahall notified the Board that this lot was available for purchase at a reasonable price and is adjacent to WRWSD owned properties. *See Motions and Resolutions below.*
- Radio System The purchase of handheld radios has been very helpful in providing instant access to the WRWSD staff and allows them to communicate with Maintenance and Security for issues that arise.

#### **Old Business:**

- The Board discussed the lagoon area and it was determined that a tree be trimmed to make the No Trespassing sign more visible and that the sign be straightened and secured.
- ♦ Treasurer Buskey asked Mgr. Cahall about a 1.94 acre plot owned by Lake Waynoka Utilities, Inc. and located on Fite-Hauck Rd. Mgr. Cahall reported that Tom Mays is still working on it and expects it to cost a little more.
- ◆ Trustee LaPlante asked for an update about the campground fire hydrant. Mgr. Cahall stated that we are waiting for recommendations from WPOA Trustees Robinson and Crank plus two fire chiefs concerning the placement of the fire hydrant. The recommendations will be given to the WPOA Board for consideration and approval. The WRWSD will then be informed of any needs.
- Trustee Beard asked Mgr. Cahall for an audit update. There have been no discrepancies.

#### New Business: None

#### Board Member Concerns: None

#### **Motions and Resolutions:**

- ♦ Motion # 2019-11 was made by Buskey and seconded by Levermore to approve the following adjustments to the 2019 Budget: Income \$1,045,582.42, Expense \$1,088,221.86 with a net income of -\$42,639.44. A roll call vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.
- ♦ Motion # 2019-12 was made by Buskey and seconded by Levermore to authorize Kay Bundy to receive Public Records training on behalf of the entire WRWSD Board of Trustees. A roll call vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.
- ♦ Motion # 2019-13 was made by Buskey and seconded by Beard to purchase Lot #2461 for \$250 plus closing costs. A yea/nay vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.

**Adjournment:** The motion to adjourn was made by LaPlante and seconded by Levermore. All were in favor and the meeting was adjourned at 7:45pm.

\*\*With the installation of new electronic meter readers, the WRWSD asks that you and/or your lawn service company be vigilant around the meters when mowing. Also, do not remove the water meter cap as this may disconnect some of the wires from the electronic meter making it unrepairable. Property owners will be responsible for damaged meters and the cost of replacement which is \$266.\*\*

President Bridges called the meeting to order at 9:30am.

Roll Call: Present: Beard, Bridges, Buskey, Hagen, Levermore, Redick, Mgr. Cahall

Absent: LaPlante (ex.)

Minutes: The minutes of the 8/26/19 WRWSD meeting were read by Asst. Recording Secretary

Maybriar. A motion was made by Hagen and seconded by Beard to approve the minutes as read. A yea/nay vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.

#### President's Report: (Jim Bridges):

• There are two seats on the WRWSD Board in the coming election. Applications are available at the WPOA Office if you are interested in running for the Board.

#### Treasurer's Report (John Buskey):

- We are 2/3 through the year and things are running as expected.
- During the month of September, the WRWSD certified through the County Auditor any late fees or fees that haven't been paid for water usage, sewer usage, water availability and sewer assessments. The WRWSD certified \$75,131.05 in those fees with most of it being water availability fees totaling \$47,000 and sewer assessments totaling \$16,592. What this means is people are not paying all of their fees so we certify them to the County Auditor and they are put onto their county taxes. In March/April and August, we receive a refund from the Auditor for people that have settled their fees. We usually only recoup 35% of the amount that we certified in the previous year. If people do not pay their fees with their taxes, they will continue to accumulate and will eventually lead to a Sheriff's sale of the property.

#### Manager and Plant Superintendent Report (Paul Cahall):

- ♦ The WRSD is very honored to receive an Auditor of the State Award for having a clean audit report and excellent record keeping from the Auditor of the State's office. Congratulations to all that worked hard to make this possible for 6 years in a row.
- With the new software, the office was alerted that a property owner was using 220 gallons of water an hour which indicated a possible leak. The home owner was contacted and it was found that a hose had been left running.
- ♦ The lake valve will open in early November so plan accordingly to remove your boat. The lake will be dropped 5-7 feet this year.
- We are above 98% of the water meters reporting. Master Meter installed a repeater to try to get that number above 99%.
- ♦ The water meter phone app is going to be released. Please look for directions in the newsletter. This will allow homeowners to track their water usage and provide an alert if it detects something unusual. Please Note: The message feature will not be activated on the Master Meter phone app. Please do not send messages as the office will not receive them. Continue to contact the office directly if you have any concerns about your water usage.
- A question was asked about the possibility to alert a homeowner about grinder pump faults with this app. Mgr. Cahall responded that it is not available.

There is very little difference between the website and smartphone app. Its merely a personal preference on your part as to which one you want to use to view your water meter/s details.








## \*\*\*\* If you like the dock you have this year and would like to have it again next year:

You cannot take a dock away from someone else just because you put a deposit on their dock.
