OHIO BOATERS SAFETY COURSE 2021

The Waynoka WaterSports Club will be teaching an Ohio Boating Education Course at 8am on Saturday, March 20th at the Lake Waynoka Lodge. Cost of this course is **\$5.00** and can be paid at the door. This course will consist of **8 hours** of instruction in a certified class followed by an exam. This year **2021** anyone younger than 39 years of age needs to pass a test certified by the State of Ohio before they can drive any type of boat powered by more than 10HP.

This class exam will fulfill the Ohio's Boater Education requirement that went into effect in January of 2000 and is administered by the ODNR Division of Watercraft. The law prohibits any person born on or after January 1st , 1982, from operating a vessel powered by more than 10HP unless the person has successfully completed either a boating education course approved by the National Association of State Boating Law Administrator (NASBLA) or a proficiency examination approved by ODNR Division of Watercraft. You can pre-register for the class by calling <u>ODNR</u> <u>Watercraft</u> at **513-734-2730** or <u>Steve Johnson</u> at **937-515** -**8164.** Be sure to reference the date and location for above class. This class is open for any age and not just for Lake Waynoka boaters.

WPOA Board of Trustees Saturday Meeting - 2/13/2021

**The deadline for submission of information for the monthly newsletter and other media releases is the Monday following the WPOA meeting at 4pm. The Office staff appreciates the cooperation of all of the clubs to share the events and activities held at Lake Waynoka.

******The WPOA Board held a closed regular meeting on February 13th in the Lodge. Social distancing was observed and masks were worn by all attendees.

Vice President Ellis called the meeting to order at 11:36am.

Roll Call: Present: Crank, Ellis, Redick, Taylor, VonWahlde, Mgr. Cahall Absent: Beard, Holt, Purdin, Raleigh (all are excused)

<u>Minutes</u>: Crank made a motion and Von Wahlde seconded to approve the 1/9/21 minutes as printed in the newsletter. A yea/nay vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.

Vice President's Report: A moment of silence was held for past Trustee and active member of our community George Kinney.

Treasurer's Report (Vern Taylor):

Operating Funds

- The total operating income for the month of January was \$136,000.00.
- The total operating <u>expense</u> for the month of January was \$127,000.00 with no unexpected expenses.
- The operating fund <u>balance</u> at the end of January was \$703,059.00.
- The operating <u>income</u> for the year at the end of January was \$136,000.00 and that is 6% of the plan for 2021. The expected income at the end of January was 5% so the WPOA is 1% over budget.
- The operating <u>expense</u> for the year at the end of January was \$127,000.00 and that is 6% of the plan for 2021. The expected expense was 8% so we are 2% under budget.

Allocated Assessment Funds

- The income for allocated operating assessments in January was \$43,000.00.
- Assessment account expenditures in January totaled \$2,000.00.
- The balance of all allocated assessment accounts at the end of January was \$442,057.92.

Invested Funds

- Invested reserves at the end of January totaled \$512,696.76.
 - Total cash on hand at the end of January was \$1,657,813.68.

Manager's Report (Paul Cahall):

- The lake valve is open until around the 15th of February. We have to close it at that time to allow the lake time to refill before draining the lagoon again in April. How fast the lake fills back up has everything to do with the weather.
- The first part of the spillway inspection was completed in mid-January. The engineers have decided to delay the digging of inspection holes for the walls. They will be scheduling that inspection for early spring.
- We have received permission from ODNR to add 100 grass carp to the lake. We will put them in shortly after completing the lagoon drain in April.
- Snow removal and the use of salt. We plow all roads but limit the use of salt to intersections and curves. This is done not for monetary reasons but to limit the amount of salt finding its way into the lake. Almost all the salt we put on the road will find its way to the lake.
- We are still dealing with constantly changing rules concerning COVID 19 so please watch the Web Site and Facebook for updates concerning WPOA sponsored and club sponsored events. If these events change or are canceled, this is where we will make those announcements. We are in constant contact with the Brown County Health Department for updates on what we can and cannot do.

Motions and Resolutions:

- Motion #328 was made by Taylor and seconded by Crank to accept the following proposed changes to the rules in the Campground:
- Temporary/Short term camping sites will be rented by reservation with the following process.
- Reservations can be made up to 30 days in advance.
- Camping fees will be paid at the time of making the reservation.
- Temporary/Short term campsites can only be reserved for 14 days at a time.
- If reservation is canceled within 7 days no refund will be given.
- All campsites will be limited to the following:
 - 3 tents without a camper.

2 tents with a camper.

- The practice of piggy backing or two campers on one site will no longer be permitted.
- A roll call vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.
- Motion #329 was made by Redick and seconded by VonWahlde that largemouth bass be changed to catch and release only. A roll call vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.
- Lot #1883 asked for a reconsideration from the Board for their variance last month. A motion was made by Crank and seconded by VonWahlde to approve the variance provided a concrete retaining wall be built. A roll call vote was taken and the motion passed with 4 yeas and 1 abstention (Redick).
- Lot #491 asked for a variance for a 3'x 9' dig in for a two slip boat dock. A yea/nay vote was taken and the variance passed unanimously.
- Lot #2621 asked for a variance for a 4' x 12' one slip covered boat dock. A yea/nay vote was taken and the variance passed unanimously.
- Lot #431/432 asked for a 14' offset variance for a boat dock and is located at the back of a cove. A yea/nay vote was taken and the variance passed unanimously.

- Between January 1st & March 15th, you must pay the annual rental fee of \$250.00.


- On March 16th, any UNPAID docks will be put back into the pool of available docks for rental on April 1st , first come first service basis.



Do not go out on the ice on the lake for

any reason.

I know it is tempting, but going out on the ice on any pond or lake is very dangerous. Lake Waynoka has a higher risk than most because we let water out of the lake under the ice to help protect the docks from a sudden rise in lake level. So while the ice may appear to be thick and solid, there could be a gap under the ice to the water, and this puts a tremendous strain on the ice sheet causing it to break without warning.



How can I participate?

- Fill out the application/design proposal.
- Fill out the waiver.
- Your hydrant will be assigned to you .
- Submit the required forms no later than 4:00pm, on April 16th, 2021 at the WPOA office in an envelope marked Art Club. Or email to sjlever1@gmail.com.
- Hydrants must be approved before work can begin.
- You will be contacted by a committee member once your application has been approved.
- To receive your application and additional information, go to the Lodge information board and Facebook. How should I begin painting after I have been approved?
- Remove all dirt, mud and debris from the hydrants before painting
- Protect the immediate area around the hydrant from paint stains **MUST** be left clean.
- The use of an oil base primer before painting will allow the paint to adhere better to the hydrant.
- Use high quality, oil based enamel paint for metal.
- Do not paint the hydrant seal and be careful with the chains.
- Painting will be allowed from time of application approval through June 19,2021.
- All hydrants must be completed by June 19, 2021.
- Winners will be announced at **Beach Day, June 26. 2021** (*time to be announced later*).



What is prohibited on the hydrant?

- Inappropriate words, advertisements, political messages, religious messages, etc.
- Stickers, glued, or attached items.
- Camouflage or designs or dark colors that significantly reduce the visibility of the hydrants.
- HYDRANTS CAN NOT BE TAMPERED WITH IN ANY MANNER.

Once I finish painting my hydrant what should I do?

- Sign the hydrant with your name and take a picture of you and the hydrant.
