#### **WPOA Board of Trustees Saturday Meeting – 11/12/2022**

- \*\*Any updates from the Friday email are indicated in italics of the summary of each report.
- \*\*The deadline for submission of information for the monthly newsletter and other media releases is the Tuesday following the WPOA meeting at 4pm. The Office staff appreciates the cooperation of all of the clubs to share the events and activities held at Lake Waynoka.

President Beard called the meeting to order at 10:04am.

Vice President Ellis led the attendees in the Lord's Prayer followed by the Pledge of Allegiance. President Beard asked that we remember all Veterans.

Roll Call: Present: Barton, Beard, Crank, Ellis, Marcks, Moore, Taylor, Mgr. Cahall

Absent: Holt and Raleigh. Both were excused.

Minutes: Taylor made a motion and Crank seconded to approve the 10/8/22 minutes as printed in the newsletter. A yea/nay vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.

**President's Report (Charlie Beard):** President Beard recognized long time maintenance worker Randy Stivers. He was a key member of our staff with many accomplishments and talents. He will be sorely missed and hard to replace. We wish him well in retirement.

#### **Treasurer's Report (Vern Taylor):**

#### **Operating funds**

- The total operating income for the month of October was \$134,000.00.
- The total operating expense for the month of October was \$156,000.00 with no unexpected expenses.
- The operating fund balance at the end of October was \$693,126.74.
- The operating income for the year at the end of October was \$2,366,000.00 and that is 92% of the plan for 2022. The expected income at the end of October was 92% so we are right on budget.
- The operating expense for the year at the end of October was \$2,219,000.00 and that is 88% of the plan for 2022. The expected expense was 87% so we are 1% over budget.

#### **Allocated Assessment Funds**

- The income for allocated operating assessments in October was \$6,000.00.
- Assessment account expenditures in October totaled \$11,000.00. This was for gym lighting upgrade and lumber for upcoming dock replacements.
- The balance of all allocated assessment accounts at the end of October was \$979,211.77.

#### **Invested Funds**

- Invested reserves at the end of October totaled \$514,892.62.
  - \* Total cash on hand at the end of October was \$2,187,231.13.

The 2023 budget is finished and passed along to the Board for review. We will be voting on the budget at the December WPOA meeting.

#### Manager's Report (Paul Cahall):

- We removed 260 barge loads of silt (1560 cubic yards of silt) in the month of August with a goal for the month of 220. We did really well running operations 21 of the possible 23 days. We have removed 713 barge loads of silt (4278 Cubic yards) so far this year. We will continue dredging operations until the end of October.
- We plan to bring the lake down 5 to 7 feet this winter for dock and shoreline work. The Valve will be opened between 15 and 30 November determined by the needs of the WRWSD. Please plan accordingly for getting your boats out of the water for the winter.
- If we can get the water down enough this year, we have the following dock projects scheduled: 1. Replace the fueling docks at the marina with concrete docks. 2. Replace the dock next to the boat ramp. 3. Replace the dock at Hiawatha.
- We removed 178 barge loads of silt (1,424 cubic yards of silt) in the month of October with a goal for the month of 220.
- Our computer networks are all up and running including online payments and online guest passes. We still have some work to be done with the gate system to make it more robust but it is up and running.
- Maintenance has been working hard on closing down the campground and working on drainage ditches along with replacing some culverts. They have also started installing the slide at Little Turtle.
- Work on the 2023 budget has been completed by the finance committee and has been turned over to the board of trustees for their input. We expect to pass the 2023 budget next month at the December meeting.
- The WPOA Personnel Policies Manual is back from review with the attorneys. Recommended changes will be reviewed with the board and we hope to have a new manual approved at the January monthly meeting.

- I met with an engineer this month to take a look at drainage issues in the campground and he issued a list of next step items that have been approved by the board. Those inspections and repairs will be worked on over the next couple of months.
- Myself, maintenance, representatives from the Long-Range Planning committee and board member Pat Raleigh met with
  the owner of the farm upstream on Straight Creek on the east end of our property to look for ways to help control silt
  coming into the lake. We will be brining in an engineer to look at observed issues to give us recommendations to improve
  our silt mitigation.

**Election Inspectors/Nominating** (Margi Borgman/Dave Patton/Nan McHugh, Nominating Chairperson): We are in the election period for Trustees. We must receive your ballot by 4pm on November 28<sup>th</sup> in order for it to be counted. The Election Committee is in agreement about election signs within the community. Trustee Barton asked if the previous election impacted the way we are voting during this election. Inspector Patton said no.

Lake Advisory (Todd Holt): None.

#### Long Range Planning Committee (Terry Borgman/Pat Raleigh):

- 1. The committee has finished a review of the December 2022 Capital Assessment forecasted costs as of September 2022. The December forecast is underrunning the cost projection made in January 2022.
- 2. The committee is meeting with the General Manager to review what capital assessment projects or services will be considered in 2023. The WPOA board vote will take place in January 2023. The capital assessment accounts include the Improvements, Lake, and Road accounts. The assessment fee review will be presented to the WPOA Board in December.
- 3. At the guidance of the Board, the committee continue to research how to determine a cost for a possible project. Professional serveries are being sought.
- 4. As dredging is on the memberships mind, we are reviewing the goals for dredging in 2022. The goal was to remove 7,900 of 15,800 cubic yards this year using three barges. The area being worked lies between the mouth of Atoka Cove and Hiawatha Cove to increase the area navigable for the boating and dredging access. This area is expected to take 2 years. The amount of material removed in six months is 6,564 Cubic yards. The lake did not have 3 barges at the beginning of the year due to the late delivery of motors for the barge, so the total goal this year is a little short.
- 5. Additionally, it was suggested that we (Board, membership, and General Manager) should consider prevention of sediment flowing into the lake at the East end. A visit was made to evaluate what possibilities could be done to minimize sediment flow. The WPOA should realize that 80% of the drainage into the lake comes from the Atoka, Kiddie Coral and Straight Creek watersheds feeding the lake. The source of this information is in the Mad Scientist Report in 2011. More solutions are being evaluated. This is a long term issue.

Rules and Regulations (Greg Stover/Pat Raleigh): Mr. Stover thanked everyone who participated in the amendments to the Restrictive Covenants election. We're especially pleased with the amendment to allow voting by mail or otherwise which we hope will increase community participation. The committee has been tasked by the Board to review the fine schedule in the general rules. There is language in the yellow book stating that no political signs are permitted within the boundaries of the community. Real estate signs are permitted on your lot.

Campground Committee (Ken Crank/Carrie Boyd): None.

**Unfinished Business: None.** 

#### **New Business:**

- There were three variances submitted for boat slips. Lot #359 for a 4'x12' digout, lot #4011 for a 6'x12' digout and lot #1823 for a 4'x12' digout. Barton made a motion and Taylor seconded to approve the requests. A yea/nay vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.
- President Beard stated that after much research and discussion, the Board will vote on a decision concerning Motion #306.
   Please see Motion #350 below.

Motions & Resolutions: Motion #350 was made by Crank and seconded by Moore that Motion #306, preventing homeowners and renters from renting permanent campground sites, be rescinded effective 12 November 2022. A roll call vote was taken and the motion passed with 7 yeas and one nay (Taylor). Trustee Raleigh voted yea by proxy which was read by Secretary Crank.

#### **Community Organizations:**

- Art Club (Joanne Edwards) There are two tickets available for Uncorked on Canvas. Thank you to maintenance for their hard work installing the slide at Destination Park. December 5<sup>th</sup> morning, we will be decorating Christmas wreaths and, in the evening, painting glasses. Please bring whatever you would like to paint and a snack to share.
- Civic Club (Michael LaPlante):— Kelly Faas was elected as our new club president. The rest was inaudible.
- Shawnee Women's Club (Margi Borgman): A big thank you to everyone who supported the Holiday Extravaganza. We would like to thank maintenance for putting up our large Christmas tree this week in the Lodge. We will begin decorating the Lodge on December 1<sup>st</sup> at 10am. We will be putting up a community tree in the area by the fireplace for residents that wish to donate an ornament. Linda Woods and Sue Levermore will be chairing Light Up the Lake this year on December 10<sup>th</sup>. There will be a car tour around the lake to view Christmas lights. Please meet at Little Turtle at 6pm. Anyone wishing to enter the home Christmas lighting contest, please see Sue or Linda for a number to place in your yard. First prize is \$150, second is \$100 and third is \$50. Santa and snacks will be available in the Lodge after the tour. We are planning our next Bunco event on January 19<sup>th</sup> beginning at 6:30.

#### **WRWSD Board of Trustees Saturday Meeting – 11/12/2022**

President P. Levermore called the meeting to order at 9:30am.

Roll Call: Present: Armstrong, Buskey, LaPlante, P. Levermore, S. Levermore, Moore, Wales, Mgr. Cahall

Minutes: A motion was made by Buskey and seconded by LaPlante to approve the 10/31/22 minutes as read. A yea/nay vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.

President's Report (P. Levermore): President P. Levermore read the following into the minutes:

#### Waynoka Regional Water and Sewer District Statement of Facts Regarding the EPA Drinking Water Notices

Property owners have asked for more detailed information about the drinking water notices which they received in the mail recently and some comments about the notices have been posted on social media that are inaccurate. We would like to share the facts and the timeline regarding the situation with our customers. First, the WRWSD Board has taken this issue very seriously and wants all property owners to know that our water is NOT contaminated.

- We had an inspection of the plant, with the Ohio EPA present, in July. The results of that inspection were reported to us that everything was okay no violations by our Class III operator.
- Due to a personnel issue, we shut down our water plant and went to Brown County water on 9/2/2022. (See WRWSD meeting minutes of 9/10/2022.)
- Due to the same personnel issue, our Class III licensed water operator was let go on 9/7/2022. (For liability reasons, the details of personnel issues cannot be discussed in public.)
- We entered into a contract for the services of a new Class III operator and started the process of ensuring everything was in proper order before we put the water plant back into service. (More detail given in the Board meeting minutes of 9/10 and 9/12.)
- As part of our process of inspecting everything before restarting the water plant, the contracted Class III operator discovered
  and reported to WRWSD on 09/30 that there were some reports on turbidity (cloudiness) taken in June and August that he
  believed may have not been reported accurately to Ohio EPA by our previous Class III operator. Revised reports were
  submitted to the Ohio EPA on 9/30.
- The Ohio EPA issued violation notices on 10/07. This was not an emergency but they required notices be sent informing the public of the situation within 30 days of their notification to us. We sent to EPA drafts of violation notices to be sent to customers.
- On 10/17 EPA gave us final approval and authorization for the notices to be sent to customers.
- The notices were mailed to customers on 10/19.
- We feel we have dealt with the challenging issues responsibly, transparently, and proactively while at the same time ensuring the safety of our customers.

Additional note: Some people have expressed a concern about the sewer plant capacity. This issue has been discussed for some time and on November 29, 2021, the Board authorized the General Manager to seek an engineering firm that could prepare a preliminary proposal for expanding the plant. On March 28, 2022, the Board entered into a contract with CT Consultants for a study to expand the plant. The Ohio EPA typically notifies a company when they need to expand their plant, but WRWSD elected to begin this process before the EPA 'triggers it'. For more detail, see the Board minutes of 11/29/2021, 3/12/2022, 3/28/2022 and subsequent meetings. 11/1/22.

#### Treasurer's Report (S. Levermore):

- 84% through the year. The income is on track as are expenses but we need to make some minor adjustments. I will be making a motion to approve an amended budget. We will be adding \$12,017 to income mostly due to the sale of the old truck and adding \$119,173 to expenses mostly due to the WPOA service contract true-up, Brown County water service charges and expenses occurring from getting the water plant up and running. *Please see Motions below*.
- We have three cd's coming due this month. First State Bank for \$104,000 water account, State Bank for \$103,000 water account and Peoples Bank for \$17,800 for legal. Treasurer S. Levermore recommends rolling them over. *Please see Motions below.*

#### Manager and Plant Superintendent Report (Paul Cahall):

- The cold weather is good for the lagoon to kill any algae. We are scheduled to open the valve between November 15<sup>th</sup> and December 1<sup>st</sup>.
- There were no major repairs needed for the water filters.
- Due to the holidays, we have pushed back reopening the water plant to the first week of December.
- The online pay option is up and running.
- The Board entered into a contract with Greg Wilson Consulting to provide a Class III operator for the foreseeable future.

Old Business: None.

New Business: None.

#### **Motions and Resolutions:**

- A motion was made by Buskey and seconded by Moore to approve the October 31<sup>st</sup> financial statement as distributed. A yea/nay vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.
- A motion was made by Buskey and seconded by LaPlante to rollover three cd's. A yea/nay vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.
- Motion #2022-25 was made by Buskey and seconded by Moore to amend the 2022 budget. A roll call vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously. A copy of the amended budget is available at the office.

**Board Member Concerns: None.** 

#### **Membership Concerns:**

- Doris Kitchen asked if the time has come to have a town hall meeting with residents to discuss switching to Brown County water permanently as lots of towns are doing. She is concerned about water issues hurting property values and wanted to know why people in the campground did not receive letters. Mgr. Cahall said that he has met with Brown County many times. The towns have switched over because they did not keep their equipment updated and ran out of money. He stated that, financially, it is not a good idea to switch as we will have zero control over the water and sewer prices. Brown County water is significantly higher and we would only be saving on personnel. President P. Levermore said that the Trustees were elected to oversee the water and sewer plants and provide clean approved water. The Board has been transparent with recent events and taken the appropriate action necessary following all EPA guidelines and suggestions by the consulting firm. He does not feel a town hall meeting is needed as the monthly meeting is open to the public and they are welcome to attend and present their questions.
- Tom Kiser asked about the size of the pipe coming in for Brown County water. Mgr. Cahall said he believes it is 6".

Adjournment: The motion to adjourn was made by Moore and seconded by LaPlante. A yea/nay vote was taken. All were in favor and the meeting was adjourned at 9:58am.

#### WRWSD Board of Trustees Monday Meeting – 10/31/2022

President P. Levermore called the meeting to order at 6:00pm.

Roll Call: Present: Armstrong, Buskey, LaPlante, P. Levermore, S. Levermore, Moore, Wales, Mgr. Cahall

Others present: Greg Wilson

Minutes: A motion was made by Buskey and seconded by Moore to approve the 10/8/22 Monthly Meeting minutes as distributed. A yea/ nay vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.

#### **President's Report** (P. Levermore):

- President P. Levermore presented a timeline of events concerning the water plant and water notices sent to property owners. The Board discussed misinformation being spread and ways to communicate with residents about the water notice facts. Therefore, the Board created a Waynoka Regional Water and Sewer District Statement of Facts Regarding the EPA Drinking Water Notices. The statement will be posted on the Lake Waynoka website with a link on Facebook. It will also be posted in the newsletter, included in the WPOA email blast the Friday before the WRWSD and WPOA Saturday meetings and copies will be available at the 11/12 WRWSD Saturday meeting. Members can also review previous and present WRWSD minutes and/or speak with Board members to address any rumors they may hear.
- Trustees Wales and Buskey continue their work on reviewing the WRWSD bylaws.

#### Treasurer's Report (S. Levermore):

- Budget season is approaching. Mgr. Cahall provided Treasurer S. Levermore with numbers for the 2023 WPOA contract. Treasurer S. Levermore will be reviewing 2022 line-item numbers for the 2023 budget.
- Trustee Wales asked how the budget was fairing and what is the total cost of reopening the water plant. It is unknown at this time.
- We are using capital money to replace and update the equipment as recommended by Greg Wilson Consulting and required by the EPA.
- Some of these capital expenditures were already in our capital improvement plan. We can look at what expenses associated with the reopening were unplanned and provide a report at a future date.
- A discussion was held about the cost of producing our own water vs. converting to Brown County water. Mgr. Cahall stated that Brown County water costs are very high compared to producing our own water.
- An inquiry was made asking if the WRWSD is carrying any debt. Buskey explained we have three bonds that mature in June 2035.

#### Manager and Plant Superintendent Report (Paul Cahall & Supt. Culver):

- Presentation from Greg Wilson on status of water plant: We had expected to reopen the water plant at the beginning of November but several items have been on backorder. We have the replacement of the sand media scheduled for November 8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup>. At that time, we will look at the under drain to see if repairs are needed. A new chlorine monitor, chemical meters and lab meters have been ordered and are being installed. We are purchasing top of the line equipment. All of our equipment is being certified. The EPA has been involved every step of the way. Greg Wilson's team will be testing raw water this week to be compared with the initial start-up water sample. He believes we're in very good shape moving forward and is anticipating restarting the water plant on or near November 21<sup>st</sup>.
- Gate system The Silco software needs to be loaded to the server and the readers have not been installed. We are trying to coordinate a time for everyone involved to get everything up and running.
- Computer update We are still working on fixing the online pay feature.
- Lagoon We plan to begin draining the lagoon on November 15<sup>th</sup>. This will take 30 or so days to complete. The WPOA plans to drop the lake by 7' this year. There will be an additional lagoon draining in April.
- Personnel We ran an ad and have several applicants.

Old Business: None.
New Business: None.

Motions and Resolutions: None. Board Member Concerns: None.

#### **Executive Session:**

- At 7:09pm, a motion was made by S. Levermore and seconded by Wales to enter into Executive Session to discuss a personnel issue and the contract with Greg Wilson Consulting. A yea/nay vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.
- At 7:43pm, a motion was made by Buskey and seconded by Wales to exit the Executive Session. A yea/nay vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.

Adjournment: The motion to adjourn was made by S. Levermore and seconded by Moore. A yea/nay vote was taken. All were in favor and the meeting was adjourned at 7:44pm.
