WPOA Board of Trustees Saturday Meeting – 12/11/2021

***The deadline for submission of information for the monthly newsletter and other media releases is the Tuesday following the WPOA meeting at 4pm. The Office staff appreciates the cooperation of all of the clubs to share the events and activities held at Lake Waynoka.*

Roll Call: Present: Beard, Ellis, Holt, Moore, Raleigh, Taylor, Mgr. Cahall
Absent: Barton, Crank and Purdin. All were excused.

Minutes: The 11/13/21 were amended to reflect Trustee Moore as present and Trustee Holt as an excused absence. Holt was recorded as present and absent. Taylor made a motion and Raleigh seconded to approve the 11/13/21 minutes as amended. A yea/nay vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.

President's Report (Charlie Beard): None

Treasurer's Report (Vern Taylor):

Operating funds

- The total operating income for the month of November was \$58,000.00.
- The total operating expense for the month of November was \$151,000.00.
- The operating fund balance at the end of November was \$835,449.05.
- The operating income for the year at the end of November was \$2,236,000.00 and that is 96% of the plan for 2021. The expected income at the end of November was 96% so the WPOA is right on budget.
- The operating expense for the year at the end of November was \$2,078,000.00 and that is 91% of the plan for 2021. The expected expense was 92% so we are 1% under budget.

Allocated Assessment Funds

- The income for allocated operating assessments in November was \$13,000.00.
- Assessment account expenditures in November totaled \$7,000.00 with fish stocking and dam repair.
- The balance of all allocated assessment accounts at the end of November was \$713,101.42.

Invested Funds

- Invested reserves at the end of November totaled \$514,133.51.
 - * Total cash on hand at the end of November was \$2,062,638.98.

Manager's Report (Paul Cahall):

- The work at the Recreation Center has been completed and we are back open normal hours. We know the length of time and the timing wasn't the most convenient but this repair needed to be done to ensure the long-term structural integrity of the building. With the supply and employment challenges facing everyone right now, we had to be flexible with our timing to make sure we got this done before winter.
- Maintenance will be repairing the other water damage in the recreation center over the next couple of months as parts become available. We do not foresee any need to limit the use of the building during these updates.
- The lowering of the lake has begun. We are hoping to bring the lake down about 7 feet so we can replace docks at Hiawatha, the beach, and marina. Remember Mother Nature has more to do with how far the lake goes down than we do. ODNR limits how fast we can let the water out.
- Bryer Cable has been sold to Spectrum Cable. For the next few months, it will still be run by Bryer but if you are a customer of them, you will be getting a notification in the future from Spectrum informing you of the changes coming to your service.
- I am currently working closely with the LRPC on the proposed 2022 capital budget and updating the 30-year plan. The LRPC has presented their recommendations to the board. They will be reviewing those recommendations and hopefully passing the 2022 budget in January.
- To address rumor control about next year's Waynoka Day. This event will be happening as previously scheduled with little changes to the casual observer. Over the last several years, the POA and the Events Coordinator has been taking on a bigger and bigger role in this annual event. Next year the POA and the Events Coordinator will head up the event.
- ODNR has approved the repairs on the dam. Buckeye Engineering is putting together the bid packages on this project and we hope to start the repairs this spring. We are told that the lake does not have to be drawn down any for these repairs to take place. There may be periods of time where the dam road will be closed but we will try and make sure signs go up beforehand so everybody knows when it will be closed.
- *We are trying to attempting to drain the lake 7-10' this year but Mother Nature is not cooperating and the EPA limits how fast we can drain it.*
- *Our Event Coordinator, Gina Dash, resigned. Amanda Yule has accepted that position and is doing a great job.*

- For Motion #336, Mgr. Cahall explained that the Recreation Center card increase is for a friend of yours to have access to the Rec Center. Each year there are only 6-8 people that buy this.
- Pete Levermore from the Zoning Committee presented several variance requests for dock dig outs:
 - ⇒ Lot #2639 – Jump – Two 4’ deep x 11’ wide digouts for double boat slips.
 - ⇒ Lot #2902 – Gardner – One 4’ deep x 12’ wide dig out for a single boat slip.
 - ⇒ Lot #687 – Morman – One 2’ deep x 12’ wide dig out for a single boat slip
 - ⇒ Lot #1883 – Wagner – Single boat slip with digout to include a covered sitting area. This is a revision of the previously approved variance request.
 - ⇒ Lot #449, 450, 451 – Gleason – One 16’ deep x 48’ wide dig out.

Motions & Resolutions:

- Motion #336 was made by Holt and seconded by Raleigh to approve the proposed 2022 budget with \$2,561,448.21 in income \$2,521,543.15 in expenses with an expected surplus of \$39,905.06. The budget includes the following changes in the dues, and fee structure:
 - Dues: increase \$10.00 from \$400.00 to \$410.00.
 - Multi Lot Fee: \$5.00 from \$100.00 to \$105.00.
 - Home owner fee: increase \$10 from \$160.00 to \$170.00.
 - Annual Mowing fees. No increase
 - Guest Cards. \$5 from \$15.00 to \$20.00
 - RFID stickers no increase.
 - Annual dock rental. No increase
 - Annual boat, golf cart, UTV, registration. No increase
 - Winter camper storage fees. No increase
 - Camping fees. No increase
 - Temporary campsites. No increase
 - Recreation Center Cards: from \$200 - \$410
 A roll call vote was taken and the motion passed with six yeas.
- Taylor made a motion and Ellis seconded to approve Lot #2639 variance request. A yea/nay vote was taken and the motion passed with six yeas.
- Ellis made a motion and Holt seconded to approve Lot #2902 variance request. A yea/nay vote was taken and the motion passed with six yeas.
- Raleigh made a motion and Holt seconded to approve Lot#687 variance request. A yea/nay vote was taken and the motion passed with six yeas.
- Raleigh made a motion and Ellis seconded to disapprove Lot #1883 variance request. A yea/nay vote was taken and the motion passed with six yeas.
- Holt made a motion to approve Lot #449,450,451 variance request. There was no second. Therefore, the motion fell to the floor and no vote was taken.

WRWSD Board of Trustees Saturday Meeting – 12/13/2021

Vice President P. Levermore called the meeting to order at 6:00 pm.

Roll Call: Present: Buskey, Hagen, LaPlante, P. Levermore, S. Levermore, Redick, Mgr. Cahall
Absent: Beard and Culver. Both were excused.
Others present: Nan Wales, Trustee elect.

Minutes: The minutes from 12/11/21 and 12/13/21 will be voted on at the next monthly WRWSD meeting on January 8th, 2022.

President's Report (Prescilla Redick): None

Treasurer's Report (John Buskey/S. Levermore): Treasurer Buskey sent out the revised budget for the Board to review and reported on the reason why some numbers had been adjusted. He then brought forth six motions. *Please see Motions and Resolutions below.*

Manager and Plant Superintendent Report (Paul Cahall & Supt. Culver): None

Old Business: Vice President P. Levermore asked about the updating of frequently asked questions. Treasurer Buskey said he has been working on it.

New Business: None

Motions and Resolutions:

Motion # 2021-13 was made by Buskey and seconded by LaPlante to transfer the November 30, 2021 end-of-month surplus of \$90,000.00 in the Sewer Operating Account to the Sewer Reserves Account, and the November 30, 2021 end-of-month surplus of \$112,000.00 in the Water Operating Account to the Water Reserves Account. A roll call vote was taken and the motion passed with six yeas.

Motion # 2021 – 14 was made by Buskey and seconded by Hagen to

- (1) adjust the District's Sewer Usage rate by \$1.25 per month from \$40.00 to \$41.25 per month; and
- (2) adjust the District's Water Usage minimum base rate by \$1.00 per month from \$25.00 to \$26.00 per month; and
- (3) adjust the District's Water Usage Additional Gallons rate by \$1.00 per each 1,000 additional gallons, from \$7.50 to \$8.50.

These adjustments will be effective January 1, 2022 for all customers, and will take effect with the WRWSD monthly statement for usage in the month of January 2022. These funds will be used for operating and plant improvement needs.

A roll call vote was taken and the motion passed with six yeas.

Motion # 2021- 15 was made by Buskey and seconded by S. Levermore that the percentage of the following fees transferred to reserve accounts be changed as follows: Sewer User Fees transferred from the Sewer Income Account to the Sewer Reserve Account be changed from 12% to 10% to be effective January 1, 2022. A roll call vote was taken and the motion passed with six yeas.

Motion # 2021 – 16 was made by Buskey and seconded by P. Levermore to adopt the WPOA/WRWSD Monthly Services Contract for FY 2022 dated December 3, 2021 in the amount of \$475,476.21, payable in monthly installments. A roll call vote was taken and the motion passed with six yeas.

Motion # 2021 – 17 was made by Buskey and seconded by Redick to adjust the following fees:

The District Grinder Pump Fee by \$700.00 from \$6,400.00 to \$7,100.00; and the District Water Tap fee by \$200.00 from \$2,000.00 to \$2,200.00. All adjustments to be effective January 1, 2022. A roll call vote was taken and the motion passed with six yeas.

Motion # 2021 – 18 was made by Buskey and seconded by LaPlante to amend the 2022 preliminary WRWSD budget (adopted by Motion 2021-07 on July 6, 2021) with total income budgeted at \$1,359,835.00, total expense budgeted at \$1,428,136.00, and a net income of -\$68,301.00 per attached revised budget dated 12-11-2021. A roll call vote was taken and the motion passed with six yeas.

Board Member Concerns: None

Adjournment: The motion to adjourn was made by LaPlante and seconded by Hagen. A yea/nay vote was taken. All were in favor and the meeting was adjourned at 6:20pm.

WRWSD Board of Trustees Saturday Meeting – 12/11/2021

Vice President P. Levermore called the meeting to order at 9:30am.

Roll Call: Present: Beard, Buskey, Hagen, LaPlante, P. Levermore, S. Levermore, Mgr. Cahall
Absent: Redick (excused)

Minutes: A motion was made by LaPlante and seconded by Beard to approve the 11/29/21 minutes as read by Assistant Recording Secretary Maybriar. A yea/nay vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.

President's Report (Redick): None

Treasurer's Report (John Buskey): This is the last monthly meeting of the year. We are in good shape and have progressed well. We will be meeting Monday to discuss raising water and sewer rates, adjust the 2021 budget and to address any issues for 2022 before voting on the budget.

Manager and Plant Superintendent Report (Paul Cahall):

- We are sending a proposal to CT Consultants for sewer expansion engineering.
- Two transfer pumps have arrived. We will be contacting Steve to get those installed along with a few other things.
- The lagoon continues to drain.

Old Business: None

New Business: Vice President P. Levermore announced that Trustees Beard and Hagen will be finishing their terms as Trustees. He announced that Sean Moore and Nan Wales were elected to fill the open positions.

Motions and Resolutions:

- A motion was made by Buskey and seconded by Beard to approve the November 30th financial statement as distributed by email. A yea/nay vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.
- Motion #2021- 12 was made by Buskey and seconded by LaPlante to amend the 2021 budget: total income budget from \$1,338,549.00 to \$1,427,318.12 with a difference of \$88,769.14; total expense budget from \$1,365,745.00 to \$1,442,207.00 with a difference of \$76,462.00; Total net income is -\$14,888.86. A roll call vote was taken and the motion passed with six yeas.

Board Member Concerns: Treasurer Buskey announced that he will begin putting together an orientation/information packet after the first of the year for new Trustees and any of those on the Board who would like to go over the information.

Membership Concerns: None

Adjournment: The motion to adjourn was made by Beard and seconded by Buskey. A yea/nay vote was taken. All were in favor and the meeting was adjourned at 9:43am.

WRWSD Board of Trustees Monday Meeting – 11/29/2021

Vice President P. Levermore called the meeting to order at 6:00 pm.

Roll Call: Present: Beard, Buskey, Hagen, LaPlante, P. Levermore, S. Levermore, Redick, Mgr. Cahall, Supt. Culver

Minutes: Buskey made a motion and LaPlante seconded to approve the 11/13/21 meeting minutes as emailed. A yea/nay vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.

President's Report (Prescilla Redick): None

Treasurer's Report (John Buskey/S. Levermore):

Treasurer Buskey explained that the budgeting process takes place at the beginning of November when Mgr. Cahall, Supt. Culver and Kay Bundy meet to work on the yearly budget. They then meet with Treasurer Buskey and Asst. Treasurer S. Levermore to review the figures. Treasurer Buskey presented and thoroughly reviewed the proposed 2022 WRWSD budget with the Trustees. Supt. Culver is still gathering pricing for the grinder pumps and taps so the proposed budget may be tweaked in that area prior to a vote and, if so, an updated copy of the 2022 proposed budget will be sent to all Trustees to review. The WRWSD budget will be need to be approved after the WPOA has approved their budget in December. Treasurer Buskey noted that major expense changes in the 2022 WRWSD proposed budget this year include an increase from \$391,000 to \$476,000 for one added WRWSD employee, cost of living increases and rising health insurance costs. We are in a growth period right now and hope to raise additional income from water/sewer tap installations equaling more customers and water/sewer delinquent recoveries from certifications from the Auditor. The 2022 anticipated net income is \$1,332,835, net expenses \$1,395,370 equaling a net income of -\$62,535. We will be raising water and sewer rates minimally in 2022 and reducing the amount we put in sewer capital reserves from 12% to 10% to offset the deficit.

Manager and Plant Superintendent Report (Paul Cahall & Supt. Culver):

- The lagoon valve is open and will remain that way until the lagoon is drained which is expected to be by the end of December. The operation of the valve will then be given to the WPOA to control the lake water level.
- The WRWSD office is completely remodeled. Staff has moved on to finishing the hallway.
- We will be getting bids in the spring to paint the water tower. The company we contracted has not completed the work.
- The WRWSD filled an open position. He will begin this week.
- The sand and gravel in our filter system will be replaced along with an inspection for any issues while it is empty. We will do one section at a time as to not interrupt service.
- There was a major water leak on Waynoka near Waynoka Cove. It has been repaired.
- Manager Cahall and Superintendent Culver requested that the Board look into to hiring someone to provide information gathering of the sewer plant expansion that will include recommendations, options moving forward and estimated costs. Mgr. Cahall suggested CT Consultants as a possibility to provide that information. We are getting close to needing to expand the sewer system and it would be advantageous to have an idea of what to expect when that happens.

Old Business: None

New Business: None

Motions and Resolutions: A motion was made by Beard and seconded by S. Levermore to move the Monday night meeting on December 27th to December 13th due to the holiday season. A yea/nay vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.

Board Member Concerns: Trustee Laplante was approached by a member of the community who asked numerous questions about the water/sewer plant and pipes. Supt. Culver stated that the WRWSD does not have galvanized, cast iron or lead piping in its system. LaPlante suggested updating the handout he received years ago when he became a Trustee that answers some of those questions. This could be given to new Trustees to help them understand how our system works. P. Levermore suggested putting FAQs on the Lake Waynoka website for members who may have the same questions. Mgr. Cahall said that this member contacted him with the questions and he was able to answer them.

Adjournment: The motion to adjourn was made by Hagen and seconded by LaPlante. A yea/nay vote was taken. All were in favor and the meeting was adjourned at 7:13pm.
