RFID DECALS:

- If not renewed, RFID decals will stop working on May 1st, 2023 at 12:00 am.
- RFID decals will be able to be renewed any time after all 2023 dues and fees have been paid.
- It costs \$15/vehicle for RFID renewal, and \$25/vehicle for new RFID decals.
- You will not need to have your registration to renew a decal, just your membership card.
- Decals can be renewed at the security building or the administration office.
- Renewals at security building can only be done by cash or check.
- The administration office can renew RFID decals over the phone with credit cards.
- If you want to renew all RFID decals under your account at one time, it must be done at the administration office.
- You must have the membership card the vehicle is registered under to renew a decal at the security building.

BOAT DOCK RENTAL:

- The dock reservation fee was due by Dec.
 15th, 2022. If you didn't pay this fee, you lost your dock reservation and must sign up for the dock lottery.
- Between January 1st, and March 15th you MUST pay the annual rental fee of \$250.00, or your dock will go into the dock lottery.
 You can not pay for your dock a full year in advance.

You can sign up for the dock lottery, starting March 1st, 2023 at our administration office. The lottery will be drawn April 3rd, 8 am, inside the lodge, and you must be present to receive a dock. Only owners and spouses are eligible, and all annual fees must be paid.

WPOA Board of Trustees Saturday Meeting – 01/14/2023

**Any updates from the Friday email are indicated in *italics* of the summary of each report.

**The deadline for submission of information for the monthly newsletter and other media releases is the Tuesday following the WPOA meeting at 4pm. The Office staff appreciates the cooperation of all of the clubs to share the events and activities held at Lake Waynoka.

Vice President Ellis called the meeting to order at 10:00am.

Vice President Ellis led the attendees in the Lord's Prayer followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

Roll Call: Present: Beard, Crank, Ellis, Marck, Moore, Raleigh, Taylor Absent: Barton, Holt and Mgr. Cahall. All were excused.

Minutes: Taylor made a motion and Raleigh seconded to approve the 12/10/22 minutes as printed in the newsletter. A yea/ nay vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.

President's Report (Charlie Beard): An ad hoc committee was formed with three WPOA trustees, Chief Nie and Jackson Township Trustees to talk about the fire gate. Their first meeting will be Monday at the Township Trustee office.

Treasurer's Report (Vern Taylor):

Operating funds

- December total operating income was \$67,000.00.
- December total operating expenses were \$198,000.00 with no unexpected expenses.
- Operating fund balance at the end of December was \$510,218.17.
- Operating income for the year at the end of December was \$2,500,000.00. That is 99% of the plan for 2022. Expected income at the end of December was 100% so 1% under budget.
- Operating expense for the year at the end of December was \$2,586,000.00. That is 103% of the plan for 2022. Expected expense at the end of December was 100% so 3% over budget.

Allocated Assessment Funds

- Income for allocated operating assessments in December were \$3,000.00
- Assessment account expenditures in December totaled \$8,000.00
- Balance of all allocated assessment accounts at the end of December were \$904,742.47.

Invested Funds

- Invested reserves at the end of December totaled \$515,477.81.
 - * Total cash on hand at the end of December was \$1,930,438.45.

Manager's Report (Paul Cahall):

- As many of you may have noticed, we have been having big problems with our phone systems. This issue was caused from
 the change from the old internet company to Spectrum and how that contract was handled by them. We are now back and
 operating on the numbers we all know and don't expect any further outages. This transition will also give us new
 opportunities to improve our phone and internet systems further.
- We had planned to bring the lake down 5 to 7 feet this winter for dock and shoreline work. The Valve has been open since late November and should remain open until about mid-February. Mother nature again is not helping us with this process but we are doing all we can without putting early boating season in jeopardy.
- The work on the drainage issues in the campground continues but has been delayed some due to the heavy rains. The good news is the engineer and the crew working on it were here the day after we had 3 inches of rain and saw the results. All drainage pipes will be cleared of obstructions and scoped for damage. We then get recommendations from the engineer on ways to improve going forward.
- We had a recent visit from MAD Scientists to look at the east end of the lake and Kiddy Coral. They are going to come back to us with suggestion on anything else we can do to reduce silt from entering the lake at those locations.
- Repairs on the lodge continue after the waterline busting. Most of these repairs are covered under our insurance and should be completed by mid-February. Maintenance is addressing other concerns in the lodge not covered under the insurance to ensure this doesn't happen again. We are also taking advantage of all the equipment being out of the restaurant to do some maintenance that will be much easier right now.
- Maintenance continues to work on ditching and clearing the roadsides of brush and obstructions.
- A committee of the board, Jackson Township Trustees and representatives from Russellville Fire department are having meetings face to face in order hammer out a solution that works for everyone on the fire gate.

Election Inspectors/Nominating (Margi Borgman/Dave Patton/Nan McHugh, Nominating Chairperson): None.

Lake Advisory (Todd Holt): None.

Long Range Planning Committee (Terry Borgman/Pat Raleigh): The committee has finished a review of the 2023 Capital assessment report. The three capital 2023 assessment accounts are being reviewed by the WPOA Board in December 2022 and will be voted upon in the January Monthly WPOA meeting. The proposed projects included are:

- **Roads** Asphalt paving, replacement culverts under roads, and road crack sealing. We continue to save funds for the Lake Waynoka paving project starting in 2029.
- Lake 6 months of dredging, Aqua Doc treatment of algae, shoreline protection, restocking of fish, general dock repairs and the replacement of the Hiawatha Dock.
 - I. New lake capital needs include:
 - 1. An additional project has been proposed to replace the Marina boat fuel dock slips with concrete slips.
 - 2. An additional study related to sediment prevention is proposed to take place in 2023. Mad Scientist will evaluate the necessary project(s) to reduce the amount of silt flowing from the Kiddie Corral, Straight Creek, and Atoka drainage areas. These projects will not take place until 2024.

- **Improvements** Replacement of exterior features of the rec center exterior, Replacement of a major HVAC unit for the gym, maintenance & repair of exercise equipment, Roofing for the Lounge and Pool buildings, replacement of the indoor pool filters and maintenance, replacement of a bush hog used for mowing, replacement of a major piece of maintenance 20 year old equipment and a salt box spreader used on a pickup truck for winter maintenance.
 - I. <u>New improvement needs include</u>:
 - 1. An additional study to study the repairs to a single truss in the lodge.
 - 2. The security camera system in the rec center and pool areas need to be replaced. The original system was installed in 2004.
 - 3. The lodge repair allowance for emergency uninsured repairs.
 - 4. The HVAC unit for the rec center gym has reached its useful life and is in need for replacement.
- 2. We continue to review professional services to determine the cost, layout, and picture of a new project at the direction of the WPOA Board.
- 3. The Committee continues to study the <u>community increasing population</u> trends and its impact on the community in the future.
 - In 2022, 41 homes were built. In the last six years, an average of 30 homes were constructed (180 homes).
 - In 2021 and 2022, 95 boat docks were built or repaired.
 - Additional revenue continues to increase due to the sale of homes and new construction and fees.

Rules and Regulations (Greg Stover/Pat Raleigh): None. Campground Committee (Ken Crank/Carrie Boyd): None. Unfinished Business: None.

New Business: Three variances were requested as follows:

Lot # 3189 Dock double boat slips a total dig out of 4' x 26' wide (4' x 10', 4' center walkway, 4' x 12') Lot # 3181, 3182 Dock double boat slips a total dig out of 4' x 28' wide (two 4' x 12', 4' center walkway) Lot # 2907, 2908 Dock double boat slips a total dig out of 4' x 28' wide (two 4' x 12', 4' center walkway) A motion was made by Crank and seconded by Raleigh to approve the variances. A yea/nay vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.

Motions & Resolutions:

- A motion was made to approve three dock variance requests. Please see New Business for details.
- Motion #353 was made by Taylor and seconded by Moore to accept the attached 2023 Capital Budget with \$784,000.00 in income \$821,500.00 in expenses. The Capital budget includes the following expenses:
 - ◊ Roads Improvement \$190,900.00.
 - ♦ Campground Improvement \$80,000.00.
 - ♦ Improvement Assessment \$338,700.00.
 - ♦ Lake and Dam Improvement \$209,900.00.
- Motion # 354 was made by Marck and seconded by Raleigh to increase the Lake and Dam assessment from \$100 to \$115 effective membership year 2023. Without further action the Lake and Dam assessment will be reduced to \$90 effective membership year 2024 as per motion #339 and continuing indefinitely. A roll call vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.

Community Organizations:

- Civic Club (Kelly Faas): We are working with Betty Purdin about the Labor Day firework show. We meet the third Tuesday of the month at 7pm. All are welcome to attend.
- Shawnee Women's Club (Margi Borgman): Our events have been postponed since the Lodge is being repaired. We will be having an Easter Egg Hunt on April 1st.

Board Comments and Concerns: None.

Membership Compliments and Concerns:

- Sue Eads expressed that she received several concerns about the new lot signs in the campground. It may hinder people
 moving their campers in and out. President Beard said that EMS requested the new reflective signs in the campground.
 Maintenance will be installing the new signs. Campers should contact Mgr. Cahall if their sign needs adjusted and he will
 let maintenance know.
- President Beard gave an update about the Lodge. The Board took a tour last week. The parkay floor is ruined, the fire pit area was badly damaged and there was significant damage to the restaurant. Insurance is paying for repairs minus our deductible. It will be at least a month before it is reopened.

Adjournment: The motion to adjourn was made by Taylor and seconded by Crank. A yea/nay vote was taken. All were in favor and the meeting was adjourned at 10:14am.

WRWSD Board of Trustees Saturday Meeting - 01/14/2023

President P. Levermore called the meeting to order at 9:30am.

Roll Call: Present: Armstrong, LaPlante, P. Levermore, S. Levermore, Moore, Wales

Absent: Buskey and Mgr. Cahall. Both were excused.

Minutes:

• A motion was made by S. Levermore and seconded by Wales to approve the 12/12/22 minutes as read. A yea/nay vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.

President's Report (P. Levermore): None.

Treasurer's Report (S. Levermore): The end of year financial statement is available. It ran as expected. We had 41 new home starts last year and have one so far this year. We received the bill from Brown County Rural Water in the amount of \$19,416.00 and the bill from the retention pond effluent monitor, required by the EPA, in the amount of \$16,790.00 neither of which was in the budget. Treasurer S. Levermore presented a motion to adjust the WRWSD expense budget to cover those two items plus a \$10,000 routine maintenance increase and a \$4,000.00 lab supply increase from what was previously approved. The difference from budgeted to adjusted is \$45,206.00 with most of the funds coming from reserves.

Manager and Plant Superintendent Report (Paul Cahall): President P. Levermore reported that the EPA upgrades to the lagoon were completed. The deep freeze caused a major waterline to freeze which had never frozen before. We were on Brown County water from 12/14 – 12/29. The lines have since thawed out and were inspected with no reported damage. The sewer plant had two valves break during the deep freeze and those have been replaced. Rumpke is reviewing our permit for sludge cake disposal. Everything is running smooth at the water plant at this time. Our turbidity (cloudiness) tests results are .08 and the EPA limit is .3 which is extremely good.

Old Business: None.

New Business: None.

Motions and Resolutions:

- A motion was made by LaPlante and seconded by Armstrong to approve the December 31st financial statement as distributed. A yea/nay vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.
- Motion # 2023-01 was made by LaPlante and seconded by Armstrong to amend 2023 WRWSD Budget expenses by \$45,206.00 to a total expense of \$1,538,871.00. A roll call vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.

Board Member Concerns: None.

Membership Concerns: Doris Kitchen – Do we have a full time Class III Operator at the water plant and is it time to pursue switching to Brown County water permanently? President P. Levermore explained that Greg Wilson is under contract for a Class III Operator and has a backup. There was a cost analysis done, based on Brown County published water rates, that shows it is more economical to produce our own water. Water and sewer rates would go up significantly if we close our water plant. As a Board, we are doing what we believe is best on behalf of the property owners.

Adjournment: The motion to adjourn was made by Moore and seconded by Wales. A yea/nay vote was taken. All were in favor and the meeting was adjourned at 9:48am.

Minutes: A motion was made by Buskey and seconded by S. Levermore to approve the 12/10/22 Monthly Meeting minutes as distributed. A yea/nay vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.

President's Report (P. Levermore): None

Treasurer's Report (S. Levermore): Four motions were presented. Please see Motions & Resolutions below.

Manager and Plant Superintendent Report (Paul Cahall & Supt. Pike):

We started draining the lagoon this morning.

We lost one WRWSD employee and interviewed another to replace him.

The Board approved end of year bonuses for the WRWSD staff.

Old Business: We've had some reports of discolored water. This is due to the turbulence of the water switching from Brown County to our own water. The EPA is pleased with our test results. If you notice any discoloration, let the water run and it should clear itself. The WRWSD staff began flushing the fire hydrants today which may add to the discoloration. The Board discussed posting a notice on Facebook and placing door hangers to notify residents when the WRWSD staff is working in their area. Mgr. Cahall will be sure to get the word out with a plan and report back to the Board.

New Business: None

Motions and Resolutions:

- Motion #2022-27 was made by LaPlante and seconded by Buskey to increase the following fees: water usage from \$26.00 to \$26.50; Additional water usage fee from \$8.50 to \$9.00; Sewer user fee from \$41.25 to \$42.25. These increases in fees shall begin January 1, 2023. A roll call vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.
- Motion #2022-28 was made by Wales and seconded by Armstrong that the percentage of the following fees transferred TO reserves accounts be changed as follows: Sewer User fees transferred from the Sewer Income account to the Sewer Reserve account be changed from 10% to 7% to be effective January 1, 2023; Water Tap fees transferred from the Water Income account to the Water Reserve account be changed from 25% to 15% to be effective January 1, 2023. A roll call vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.
- Motion #2022-29 was made by LaPlante and seconded by Moore to amend the 2022 budget. A copy of the budget amendments is available in the Office. A roll call vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.
- Motion #2022-30 was made by LaPlante and seconded by Buskey to amend the 2023 preliminary WRWSD budget
 (adopted by motion #2022-11 on June 11, 2022) with total income budgeted at \$1,311,029.00, total expense budgeted at
 \$1,493,665.00 with a net income of \$-182,636.00. A roll call vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.

Even though its cold outside the Waynoka WaterSports Club is heating things up working on plans for a HOT! HOT! 15th Annual Poker Run event this August.


The backbone of this event are lakeside property owners who are willing to open their property and hearts to be a Poker Run Stop host. We're in need of additional Stop hosts for this year






