WPOA Board of Trustees Saturday Meeting – 06/10/2023

**Any updates from the Friday email are indicated in *italics* of the summary of each report.

**The deadline for submission of information for the monthly newsletter and other media releases is the Tuesday following the WPOA meeting at 4pm. The Office staff appreciates the cooperation of all of the clubs to share the events and activities held at Lake Waynoka.

President Ellis called the meeting to order at 10:00am.

President Ellis led the attendees in the Lord's Prayer followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

Roll Call: Present: Barton, Crank, Eads, Ellis, Marck, Moore, Raleigh, Taylor, Mgr. Cahall Absent: Bynum (ex.)

Minutes: Taylor made a motion and Moore seconded to approve the 5/13/23 WPOA Monthly minutes as printed in the newsletter. A yea/nay vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.

President's Report (Ellis): There are 5 basic hookup sites in the campground available. The Board reviewed a request to rent second campground sites to members. It was discussed and we decided against it and will be leaving the policy as it stands. Mgr. Cahall said there are only 3 sites available as of today.

Treasurer's Report (Barton):

Operating funds

- May total operating income was \$204,000.
- May total operating expenses were \$185,000.00 with no unexpected expenses.
- Operating fund balance at the end of May was \$1,238,009.11.
- Operating income for the year at the end of May was \$1,790,000.00. That is 67% of the plan for 2023. Expected income at the end of May was 66% so 1% over budget.
- Operating expense for the year at the end of May was \$952,000.00. That is 36% of the plan for 2023. Expected expense at the end of May was 39% so 3% under budget.

Allocated Assessment Funds

- Income for allocated operating assessments in May were \$32,000.00
- Assessment account expenditures in May totaled \$83,000 for Rec Center Security and HVAC Upgrades, Campground drainage.
- Balance of all allocated assessment accounts at the end of May were \$1,425,145.00.

Invested Funds

Invested Reserves at the end of May totaled \$517,570.19.
Total cash on hand at the end of May was \$3,180,724.30.

Manager's Report (Paul Cahall):

- The main valve on the lake was closed in mid-April after completing the spring draining of the lagoon. It has been a very dry spring. According to the national weather service on average from April 1 until now we should have gotten about 10 inches of rain and locally, we have received less than 2 inches. The lake is filled by the flow of straight creek and runoff from rain events. We need one really good rainstorm and the lake will fill. During a heavy rain event 1 inch of rain can result in as much as a foot of water in the lake. Mother Nature will fill the lake hopefully soon but, in the meantime, please be careful if you are out boating. Under water hazards will be more prevalent until the lake refills. Please run at reduced speed because wake is more destructive to shorelines when the lake is low.
- We continue to work with Aquadoc to control algae in the lake. Aquadoc comes out every Thursday to treat the algae that is growing. They are doing everything that the EPA permit will allow them to do as far as treating the lake. The clear warm days and lack of any rain over the last month is creating in their words a perfect greenhouse for the growth of the algae. With a little help from mother nature, we will get this algae bloom under control.
- Waynoka Day is coming up on the 15th of July. Kim has been busy lining up games for the kids, venders, and working with the Lake Waynoka clubs to create a fun day for us all to come out and enjoy.
- Dredging continues to be on hold until water levels rise enough for the operation of our equipment. As soon as that happens, we will be back hard at work.
- The Recreation Centers HVAC system has been completed and working well. We have also purchased 2 new treadmills to replace some older worn-out units.

Mgr. Cahall addressed Facebook comments and rumors. Please be kind in your comments on Facebook. There is no leak in the dam. ODNR inspected the dam in May and found no issues. We do not fill the reservoir with main lake water and your drinking water does not come from the main lake. The wastewater lagoon is approximately 11 acres. The EPA will only allow us to drain the lagoon from November 1st to May 1st. In the fall, we open the valve for 6-8 weeks to empty the lagoon. The valve is closed in early January. We open the valve to drain the lagoon again at the beginning of April for 2 weeks. We normally have 10" – 12" of rain in the spring to refill the lake. This year we have had 1". Nothing was done differently this year. Straight creek fills the lake and it has been dry this year. Aqua Doc is treating the lake for algae every Thursday. No rain, low water levels and sunshine has increased algae growth. The EPA has regulations that Aqua Doc must follow when treating the lake. President Ellis asked Mgr. Cahall to reach out to the Mad Scientist for assistance in determining the cause of our algae growth and possible solutions to control its growth. She has read that new home construction, dredging, fertilizers, ect. contribute to algae growth. With algae being an issue the past few years, she says it's time to bring in the experts for an evaluation.

Lake Waynoka Police & Security Report for May 2023 (Chief Callahan):

Other information from the Police Department

- The state issued burn ban has been lifted as of June 1, 2023. Please follow the WPOA General Rules and Regulations (II)(2) and notify the front gate of any intended open burning. Please ensure that fires are well controlled with a water source available for everyone's safety.
- The Police Department is currently investigating numerous incidents of vandalism in bathroom facilities of multiple recreational areas. The Police Department has increased patrols in these areas, however we are asking for assistance and the cooperation of the community, as officers can not be in all locations at one time. If anyone has information that can assist the investigation, please email Chief Callahan at <u>callahan@lakewaynoka.com</u>. Again, we ask to work as one cohesive community to ensure that all areas are well taken care of for all to enjoy, and without possible information being reported to the Police Department, we can only continue to look for leads and keep increased patrol in these areas.
- The Police Department is here to assist and protect the community in any way we can. Please help the community and report any information, any suspicious activity, and/or criminal activity. We ask for your information only for possible follow-up for statements, however we assure you that your name and information will never be shared with suspects as it is strictly to assist with any investigations.
- Chief Callahan reiterated the need for community members to be vigilant and report any suspicious activities. If you happen to have a video doorbell, please let the Officers know as that may be helpful to their investigation. Posting information on social media hinders the investigation and causes frustrations.
- Chief Callahan addressed concerns about juveniles driving golf carts. Anyone driving a golf cart must have a valid driver's license.

Election Inspectors/Nominating (Margi Borgman/Dave Patton/Nan McHugh, Nominating Chairperson): None

Lake Advisory (T. Redick/Jim Marck): We will be having our first meeting this week and will be focusing on the Code of Regulations concerning lake lowering and lake ecology.

Long Range Planning Committee (Terry Borgman/Pat Raleigh):

1. Current Projects – The LRPC is working on a summation report for the WPOA Board of progress to date and expectation of progress by the end of 2023 for dredging the "hump" at the east end of the lake. The committee has also been reviewing how to best maintain an historical record of capital assessment account information. 2. Community goals and objectives – The Lake Waynoka Community Vision, Values, Goals and Objectives document, written by the Board of Trustees and the LRPC, outlines eight Community Goals and Objectives. This month, the topics if security and Safety are addressed: Objective: Maintain a certified and equipped Lake Waynoka Security Department with each ranger providing both law enforcement and emergency medical technician services to enhance the safety and security of all Lake Waynoka residents and guests. 2023 Execution: Budgeting is in place for future replacement of patrol cars. Objective: Continue to increase security through the integrated use of gates, camera, lighting, and other technological tools to limit unauthorized access and elevate identification capability by the security department thereby promoting a safe and secure environment within Lake Waynoka. 2023 Execution: The Recreation Center security camera system originally installed in 2004 was replaced. Safer access to the emergency fire/EMS gate on Martin-Alexander Road was created by moving the gate and fence away from the road. Objective: Continue to review, modify, publish and promote the WPOA Code of Regulations and the WPOA Rules and Regulations to ensure that all WPOA members and guests are aware of these governing documents that reduce conflict and increase enjoyment of facilities and amenities within Lake Waynoka. 2023 Execution: The WPOA Code of Regulations and Rules and Regulations are accessible on the Lake Waynoka website, along with the LRPC Annual Report which contains the Lake Waynoka community vision, values, goals and objectives. Objective: Maintain a high standard of safe watercraft operation by consistent and effective enforcement of all Sate laws and WPOA rules to help avoid watercraft injuries and accidents to members and guests on Lake Waynoka waters. 2023 execution: The marina security boat motor was replaced. Boating guides are available on the Lake Waynoka website and all boaters are encouraged to complete the requirements for the ODNR Boater Education Law. 3. There is an open position on the LRPC. Contact Terry Borgman at 937-515-7842 if you are interested in serving on this committee.

Rules and Regulations (John Buskey/Pat Raleigh): Chairperson Buskey announced the committee members. We are continuing to revise fine schedules as requested by the Board. Our next meeting is June 16th.

Campground Committee (Carrie Paul/Sue Eads): None

Unfinished Business: President Ellis said the Board discussed Motion #361 at the workshop and asked Mgr. Cahall to discuss the reason for the motion. It was brought to our attention that several temporary campers bring unregistered UTVs and/or golf carts to the campground. The motion is to require the inspection of such vehicles and collect a fee for a temporary sticker. *See Motion below.*

New Business: Trustee Raleigh presented information on the new Lodge/ Lounge /Restaurant proposal. Information gathering began 3 years ago with community input gathered and organized by the Long Range Planning Committee. The Board tasked McCarty & Associates to present a rendering based on that feedback. Information and drawings will be posted on the Lake Waynoka website on Monday. There will be a community meeting about the new building right after the July 8th WPOA monthly meeting. The Architect will be present to explain the project and answer any questions. We encourage all community members to view the plans and attend the meeting. Property owners will be voting on funding the new building later this year. LRPC Chairperson Terry Borgman asked that everyone attend the meetings, look at the project and give your feedback as the Board is still gathering cost information. Treasurer Barton reiterated the request that people attend the meetings and look at the plans. President Ellis said that it would be careless of the Board to not do anything about our current building that requires many costly repairs.

Motions & Resolutions: Motion # 361 was made by Raleigh and seconded by Moore to require temporary campers who wish to bring an unregistered golf cart or UTV into Lake Waynoka to get a temporary registration and pass to use them. This temporary pass can be obtained from the campground office for up to 14 days at a cost of \$10 per visit. A roll call vote was taken and the motion passed with 7 yeas and 1 nay (Taylor).

Community Organizations:

- Civic Club (Betty Purdin) We host Bingo twice a month at 7pm.
- Shawnee Women's Club (Margi Borgman) Thank you to everyone that volunteered at the Rubber Duck regatta and Ice Cream Social. We hosted a luncheon with the Lake Lorelei Women's Club and they were very impressed with our amenities. Their lake does not have a lodge or restaurant and their annual dues are the same as ours. We should be thankful for everything we have. On Waynoka Day, we will have a booth with hot dogs, pulled pork, walking tacos and basket raffles. All proceeds allow us to contribute back to the community so please stop by and support us.
- Art Club (Joanne Edwards) We will be painting a mural on the Marina building facing the gas pumps. Everyone is invited to help paint. We are exploring putting a swing in Destination Park at Little Turtle and are asking for donations.

Board Comments and Concerns: None

Membership Compliments and Concerns:

- Don Hudak Asked about having the WPOA meetings on Zoom for those who cannot make it to the monthly meeting. Mgr. Cahall said that they have been advised by the lake attorney not to do that. President Ellis said they will look into it. Mr. Hudak thanked Mgr. Cahall for his explanation about lake lowering and lagoon draining and asked about draining the lagoon earlier. Mgr. Cahall explained that even though the sewer plant was built for direct discharge, the EPA will not allow discharge between May 1st and November 1st. The lagoon must hold all the wastewater discharge between that time so that is why we drain it as close to May 1st as possible. More homes equal more time to drain so we have enough water space. There will be huge fines if the lagoon overflows which will affect everyone's pocketbooks.
- Jim Prather presented a campground issue. President Ellis and Mgr. Cahall have already addressed the matter and Mgr. Cahall will get with Mr. Prather after the meeting to discuss the resolution.
- Jennifer Bartsch Lives across from Marina Point and brought her concerns about the loud music and offensive language. She said they cannot hold a conversation around their firepit and can hear every word inside their home. President Ellis said that the Board discussed this at the Monday workshop and had Mgr. Cahall speak to the Marina about lowering the music volume, reducing explicit language and shutting down earlier. The Board will be closely monitoring Marina Point.
- Kerry McNeil Suggested limiting wake surfing to 7-11am or 8-noon so everyone can enjoy time on their boat without huge wakes. President Ellis thanked him for his concern and will look into it.
- Dana Zimmerman Disagrees with temporary campers being able to bring UTVs and/or golf carts into the campground area. They are not vested property owners and the damage they may cause will come out of dues paying member's pockets. President Ellis said that temporary campers are only able to rent a site on a permanent member's green card and that the property owner is ultimately responsible for any damage costs. Trustee Eads said that the unregistered golf carts are a safety risk which presented a need for the motion. The Board will explore this further.
- Mary Starek Why are people being allowed into the lake that are not property owners and do not have a pass called in? She recently found out that people can enter the community by saying they are going to the Lounge and/or restaurant. We are paying for these amenities and we could be liable if someone gets hurt after leaving the bar. President Ellis said the Board will discuss the current policy.

Adjournment: The motion to adjourn was made by Taylor and seconded by Barton. A yea/nay vote was taken. All were in favor and the meeting was adjourned at 11:08am.

Secretary Wales called the meeting to order at 9:30am.

Minutes: A motion was made by Buskey and seconded by S. Levermore to approve the 5/30/23 minutes as read. A yea/nay vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.

President's Report (P. Levermore): Secretary Wales asked Election Inspector, Margi Borgman, to lead Susan Kost in the Oath of Office as a newly installed Trustee on the WRWSD Board.

Treasurer's Report (S. Levermore): We are 42% through the year and are on right on track for income and expenses. The fire hydrant maintenance project was financed through our reserves and we are well under budget from what we had expected. A motion to approve the May 31st financial statement was made. *Please see below.*

Manager and Plant Superintendent Report (Paul Cahall/Dan Pike):

- The EPA recommended dredging of the lagoon is almost complete.
- The changing of the carbon in the filters is finished.
- The camera system has been installed and is working.

Motions and Resolutions: A motion was made by Buskey and seconded by Armstrong to approve the May 31st financial statement as distributed. A yea/nay vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.


Board Member Concerns: None

- John Aldrich asked if WRWSD billing could be emailed to members wanting that service and not be sent a monthly statement by mail. It would save some costs. Mgr. Cahall responded that he has been discussing this with our IT person and our current technology won't allow us to do it at this time.
- Dale Amyx asked for a water level clarification. Mgr. Cahall said the lake drawdown is to drain lagoon wastewater which is an EPA requirement. The valve was opened on April 3rd and closed on April 20th. We have only had 1" of rainfall this year as opposed to 11" in years past.

Adjournment: The motion to adjourn was made by Buskey and seconded by Armstrong. A yea/nay vote was taken. All were in favor and the meeting was adjourned at 9:45am.

WRWSD Board of Trustees Monday Meeting – 05/30/2023

President P. Levermore called the meeting to order at 6:00pm.

Roll Call: Present: Armstrong, Buskey, P. Levermore, S. Levermore, Moore, Wales, Mgr. Cahall, Supt. Pike

Minutes: A motion was made by Armstrong and seconded by Buskey to approve the 5/13/23 Monthly Meeting minutes as distributed. A yea/nay vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.

President's Report (P. Levermore):

- Thank you to the recruiting committee for their work.
- We will be having the public WRWSD water plant open house on June 17th from 11-2.
- Secretary Wales will be leading the June 10th public meeting.

Treasurer's Report (S. Levermore): None

Manager and Plant Superintendent Report (Paul Cahall & Supt. Pike):

- Lake level The main lake is required to be drained twice a year to primarily dilute the required drainage from the WRWSD lagoon, per OEPA requirements. The lagoon is drained to allow proper capacity of waste treatment throughout the year (in other words it allows everyone's toilets and grinder pumps to function). No discharges from the lagoon are permitted from May 1st November 1st per EPA regulations. Nothing was done differently with regard to draining the lagoon, and therefore the main lake as well, then in year's past. The valve has been closed for 6 weeks, but there has been no significant rainfall. Dredging will give us more capacity in the lagoon, but at this point we are still required to drain the lagoon in spring and fall.
- Filters Changing of the carbon in both filters is scheduled to begin tomorrow. It will take a few days to complete. Dredging of the lagoon begins tomorrow.
- Fire Hydrants Supt. Pike presented the fire hydrant report. We are 80% finished with flushing, greasing and repairing hydrants.
- Dam inspections The ODNR did a thorough inspection of the WRWSD dams for the lagoon and back-up reservoir, as well as the WPOA main lake. We are waiting on the official report for the status of WRWSD dams.
- The WRWSD Open House is scheduled for June 17th from 11-2. It will include a walking tour with the water treatment process explained. Residents will be able to see the newly installed equipment. We plan to advertise the event on Facebook, in the newsletter and an email blast.
- Water tower pressure monitor Steve is comparing the cost and types of meters available before we submit a quote.
- Asset management system This is a State required software system. It will record equipment functions and preventative maintenance schedules. Mgr. Cahall and Supt. Pike are gathering the cost information to present to the Board.
- Supt. Pike went over the water loss report. We had one leak and used a lot of water between sludge pressing and fire hydrant flushing. We continue to remain well below local and national averages.
- Personnel Tina will be taking over WRWSD admin duties.

Old Business: The Board asked for a camera update. Mgr. Cahall will check with AJ about installation progress.

New Business: None

Motions and Resolutions:

- Resolution # 2023-03 was made by Buskey and seconded by Wales to a resolution revoking, rescinding and repealing motions of the board of trustees for the Waynoka Regional Water and Sewer District be it resolved by the Trustees of the Waynoka Regional Water and Sewer District ("WRWSD"), Brown County, Ohio, a majority or more of all members thereof concurring, that: SECTION 1. The WRWSD has adopted revised Bylaws and Procedural Rules and Regulations for WRWSD, on the 13th day of May, 2023. SECTION 2. That the adopted revised Bylaws and Procedural Rules and Regulations have reduced to writing previous motions of the Trustees of WRWSD, or have made them immaterial. SECTION 3. To the extent that Motion 2007-05 and Motion 2004-02, or any other Motion that was accepted in the most recent revisions of the Bylaws and Procedural Rules and Regulations, they are hereby revoked, rescinded and repealed. A roll call vote was taken and the resolution passed unanimously.
- Motion # 2023-12 was made after Executive Session. Please see below.

Board Member Concerns: None

- At 6:55pm, Moore made a motion and Buskey seconded to enter into Executive Session to discuss appointing a new Trustee to the Board. A roll call vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.
- At 6:58pm, Buskey made a motion and Wales seconded to exit Executive Session. A roll call vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.

After the Executive Session, Motion #2023-12 was made by Buskey and seconded by Moore to appoint Susan Kost to the WRWSD Board of Trustees on June 10th, 2023. A roll call vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.

Adjournment: The motion to adjourn was made by Buskey and seconded by Wales. A yea/nay vote was taken. All were in favor and the meeting was adjourned at 7:00pm.


