

WPOA Board of Trustees Saturday Meeting – 05/13/2023

- **Any updates from the Friday email are indicated in italics of the summary of each report.
- **The deadline for submission of information for the monthly newsletter and other media releases is the Tuesday following the WPOA meeting at 4pm. The Office staff appreciates the cooperation of all of the clubs to share the events and activities held at Lake Waynoka.

President Ellis called the meeting to order at 10:00am.

President Ellis led the attendees in the Lord's Prayer followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

Roll Call: Present: Bynum, Crank, Eads, Ellis, Marck, Moore, Raleigh, Taylor, Mgr. Cahall

Absent: Barton (ex.)

Minutes:

- Taylor made a motion and Moore seconded to approve the 4/8/23 WPOA Monthly minutes as printed in the newsletter. A yea/nay vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.
- Moore made a motion and Taylor seconded to approve the 4/15/23 Annual Meeting minutes as printed in the newsletter. A yea/nay vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.

President's Report (Ellis):

- President Ellis wished all the Mother's a very happy Mother's Day and thanked them for their hand in raising children.
- President Ellis asked Election Inspector Mari Borgman to announce this year's installed Trustees. Ms. Borgman welcomed Sue Eads, Rob Bynum, Pat Raleigh and Sean Moore to the Board. President Ellis thanked the Board members for serving and said she is looking forward to a great year.
- President Ellis asked Assistant Recording Secretary Maybriar to read the 2023 Committee Chairs and Board Liaisons. Finance John Barton; Lake Advisory Tim Redick (Chair) and Jim Marck (Liaison); Rules & Regulations John Buskey (Chair) and Pat Raleigh (Liaison); Campground Carrie Boyd (Chair) and Sue Eads (Liaison); Building/Zoning Pete Levermore (Chair) and Sean Moore (Liaison); Long Range Planning Committee Terry Borgman (Chair) and Pat Raleigh (Liaison); Election Nan McHugh (Nominating Chair) and Election Inspectors Margi Borgman and Dave Patton. President Ellis thanked everyone for serving.
- President Ellis addressed concerns about the Boat Safety class being cancelled this year. The reason for the cancellation is the Lodge was closed and the volunteer teaching the course was not able to get the course rescheduled. The Boat Safety course is available online at the ODNR website. She encouraged everyone to take the class so we are all safe on the water.

Treasurer's Report (Barton):

Operating funds

- April total operating income was \$289,000.
- April total operating expenses were \$204,000.00 with no unexpected expenses.
- Operating fund balance at the end of April was \$1,243,865.03.
- Operating income for the year at the end of April was \$1,586,000.00. That is 59% of the plan for 2023. Expected income at the end of April was 59% so right on budget.
- Operating expense for the year at the end of April was \$767,000.00. That is 29% of the plan for 2023. Expected expense at the end of April was 31% so 2% under budget.

Allocated Assessment Funds

- Income for allocated operating assessments in April were \$55,000.00
- Assessment account expenditures in April totaled \$55,000 for culvert repair.
- Balance of all allocated assessment accounts at the end of April were \$1,476,438.90.

Invested Funds

Invested Reserves at the end of April totaled \$516,553.64.

Total cash on hand at the end of April was \$3,236,857.57.

Manager's Report (Paul Cahall):

- The main valve on the lake was closed in mid-April after completing the spring draining of the lagoon. It has been a fairly dry spring so it has taken longer than normal for the lake to return to full pool. Mother Nature will fill the lake soon but, in the meantime, please be careful if you are out boating. Under water hazards will be more prevalent until the lake refills. Please run at reduced speed because wake is more destructive to shorelines when the lake is low.
- Maintenance is hard at work getting everything ready for the season. The dredging barges have been rehabbed along with new paint to make sure they last for many years in the future. They are currently cleaning and making repairs on the pools so they can be filled and ready for use on 26 May.

- Work continues on the replacement of the heating and air unit at the gym. We have replaced several old culverts and a few more to go in preparation of paving this year.
- The drainage work was completed in the campground over the winter. I am glad to say has made a major difference on water being able to leave the campground after a big rain. We are still awaiting the engineering report on other suggested upgrades. The campground committee and the board will review these recommendations for further action.
- I am sorry to announce that there has been a rash of vandalism in the recreation areas. The police department has stepped up patrols and is asking for your help if you see anything going on, please report it to the front gate.
- The first treatment for weeds and algae in the lake was completed on 11 May and will continue weekly for the rest of the season.
- The lake is still low. We did not do anything differently this year as opposed to years past. There has not been enough rain this spring to refill it. Mgr. Cahall advised everyone to slow down on the lake and be aware of underwater hazards that you may not normally see.

Long Range Planning Committee (Terry Borgman/Pat Raleigh):

- 1. Current Projects: The LRPC has presented its Annual Report to the Board and is waiting on approval from the Board to put it on the Lake Waynoka website for the community to read.
- 2. Community Goals and Objectives: The Lake Waynoka Community Vision, Values Goals and Objectives document, written by the Board of Trustees and the LRPC, outlines eight Community Goals and Objectives. One of these, Lake Protection and Conservation, addresses our most valued community asset, the lake:
 - a. Objective: Maintain an effective dredging program to ensure acceptable navigability of the main lake and all coves. **2023 execution**: Six months of barge dredging will target "the hump" at the east end of the lake. A study for sediment prevention control will determine feasibility to reduce silt entering the lake from Straight Creek.
 - b. Objective: Protect the lake shoreline against erosion by enforcing rules on the rocking of all lakefront lots, including both private and WPOA owned. **2023 execution:** *Ongoing riprap repair program is in place.*
 - c. Objective: Properly maintain the condition of the dam, weir area and valve, including recommended regular inspections. **2023 execution**: *Annual repairs are budgeted*.
 - d. Objective: Establish and maintain an acceptable balance of fish population and lake habitat while recognizing other recreational needs and uses of the entire membership. **2023 execution:** *Annual stocking of fish and Aqua Doc treatments are budgeted.*
 - e. Objective: Properly maintain all lake access areas, including amenities included therein. **2023 execution:** *Repairs to public docks, including the Marina Dock, are scheduled.*
 - f. Objective: Support the control of the geese, beavers and any other invasive species of animals or plants that might affect the health of the lake and damage to property. **2023 execution:** *Annual goose population control has been performed.*
- 3. There is an open position on the LRPC> Contact Terry Borgman at 937-515-7842 if interested in serving on this committee. Terry asked that everyone please read the committee's objectives as they are being transparent for members.

Rules and Regulations (John Buskey/Pat Raleigh): None

Campground Committee (Carrie Paul/Sue Eads): Jerry Abbatiello said there are empty spots in the Campground and asked if there were any new rules passed stating a homeowner cannot rent a campsite. President Ellis stated no. A homeowner may rent a campsite. She thanked Ken Crank for being the campground Board liaison the past few years.

Unfinished Business: Pete Levermore presented an amendment to Zoning/Building requirements concerning fences and dog kennels. *See Motion # 360 below.* The Board had asked the committee to better define this section as it was very vague. President Ellis stated that this basically eliminates a privacy fence around an entire yard. Members can always ask for a variance.

New Business: None

Motions & Resolutions:

- Motion #360 was made by Raleigh and seconded by Marck. It is moved that: Rules and Regs volume 2, Zoning Building Requirements, section X. Fences and Dog Kennels add new items D and E. A roll call vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.
- A motion was made by Ellis and seconded by Eads to approve the LRPC Annual document. A yea/nay vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.

Community Organizations:

- Civic (Michael LaPlante) Bingo is the 2nd and 4th Saturday of the month. Doors open at 6pm and begins at 7pm. The community garage sale is May 20th.
- Chapel Vacation Bible School is at the end of July. Services are at 10am on Sunday mornings.
- Shawnee Women's Club (Margi Borgman) Our Club meets the 1st Wednesday of the month at 10am in the Lodge. The Rubberduck Regatta and ice cream social is scheduled on May 26th at 6pm in the pool area. The rain date is May 27th. Margi thanked Pete Levermore and Dan Federico for the community shed renovations.

Board Comments and Concerns: None

Membership Compliments and Concerns:

- Steve Meese said that contractors at his house are entering 1 Waynoka Drive into their GPS and it is taking them to the back gate. He asked if anything has changed or can be done to correct this issue. AJ will look into it. Trustee Eads suggested Waze navigation as an alternative to Google.
- Kelly Williamson has noticed an increase in rock throwing in Little Turtle Cove. Rocks have been thrown into boats as well. There was a sign up saying no rock throwing, but it was torn down. President Ellis said the Board would discuss options and, in the meantime, asked Mgr. Cahall to purchase a more permanent sign. VP Taylor told her to call Security if she sees someone throwing rocks.

Adjournment: The motion to adjourn was made by Taylor and seconded by Crank. A yea/nay vote was taken. All were in favor and the meeting was adjourned at 10:30am.

WRWSD Board of Trustees Saturday Meeting – 05/13/2023

President P. Levermore called the meeting to order at 9:30am.

Roll Call: Present: Armstrong, Buskey, P. Levermore, S. Levermore, Moore, Wales, Mgr. Cahall

Minutes: A motion was made by Buskey and seconded by Wales to approve the 4/24/23 minutes as read. A yea/nay vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.

President's Report (P. Levermore):

- The WRWSD plant tour for members is scheduled for June 17th from 11am-2pm. Please look for posts about the event.
- We have an open Trustee position on the WRWSD Board. We are hoping to fill the position in the coming month. If you are interested, please pick up an application at the Office.

Treasurer's Report (S. Levermore):

- We are 1/3 of the way through the year and are running as expected.
- We will be adjusting the budget to account for dredging the lagoon. The cost is \$120,000 and will be paid for from the Sewer Reserve account. *Please see Motion #2023-11 below*.

Manager and Plant Superintendent Report (Paul Cahall/Dan Pike):

- Sludge pressing and removal has been completed. The lagoon dredging is scheduled to begin next week.
- The ODNR inspected the dam. The WRWSD has 3 areas they inspect. The lagoon, reservoir and back-up lake. They suggested work on the back-up lake drain valve. We will be getting clarification from them as we were told during the previous inspection that our pumps were sufficient.

Old Business: None New Business: None

Motions and Resolutions:

- A motion was made by Buskey and seconded by Moore to approve the April 30th financial statement as distributed. A yea/ nay vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.
- Motion # 2023-11 was made by Wales and seconded by S. Levermore to amend 2023 WRWSD Budget expenses by \$128,100.00 for a total of \$1,871,697.00. Discussion: President P. Levermore noted that the Board Trustees were sent a copy of the motion to review before today's vote. A roll call vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.
- Resolution #2023-01 was made by Buskey and seconded by Armstrong to adopt new Bylaws for the Board of Trustees for the Waynoka Regional Water and Sewer District. A roll call vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.
- Resolution #2023-02 was made by Buskey and seconded by Wales to adopt new Rules and regulations for the Board of Trustees for the Waynoka Regional Water and Sewer District. A roll call vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.

Board Member Concerns: President P. Levermore thanked Buskey and Wales for their hard work on updating the Bylaws and Rules & Regulations. Trustee Buskey said that the WRWSD Bylaws and Rules and Regulations have not been updated since 1992. They are now compliant with current State laws and contain other language updates. The new documents will be posted on the Lake Waynoka website sometime this week.

Membership Concerns: None

Adjournment: The motion to adjourn was made by Wales and seconded by Moore. A yea/nay vote was taken. All were in favor and the meeting was adjourned at 9:48am.

WRWSD Board of Trustees Monday Meeting – 04/24/2023

President P. Levermore called the meeting to order at 6:00pm.

Roll Call: Present: Armstrong, Buskey, P. Levermore, S. Levermore, Moore, Wales, Mgr. Cahall, Supt. Pike

Minutes:

- A motion was made by Armstrong and seconded by Wales to approve the 4/8/23 Monthly Meeting minutes as distributed. A yea/nay vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.
- A motion was made by Armstrong and seconded by Wales to approve the 4/15/23 Annual Meeting minutes as distributed. A yea/nay vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.

President's Report (P. Levermore): The Board was previously sent the electronic report of the monthly WRWSD gate activity to review. Based on that review, and discussion, the Board will not require that report printed on a monthly basis. Since the data is collected monthly, the Board will know it is available for review as needed, upon request.

Treasurer's Report (S. Levermore): We have some good news to report. We have spent less than 10% of our allocated chemical budget and are 25% through the year. Supt. Pike explained that the newly installed chemical dispersion/ejectors are very efficient and this is the reason for the decrease in chemical purchases. Supt. Pike noted that we typically use less chemicals this time of year and he expects an increase in purchases this summer as we will have more homes using water and higher temperatures typically require higher use of chemicals.

Manager and Plant Superintendent Report (Paul Cahall & Supt. Pike):

- Lagoon The valve is closed. Our PH is still high at the bottom of the lagoon. Mgr. Cahall and Supt. Pike presented a proposal from Gullett to dredge the lagoon which should help correct the issue (*Motion #2023-10*). The Board discussed installing a lagoon bubbler in the future to keep the water moving and plan to build it into the 2024 budget.
- Filters New carbon will be installed in the water filters sometime in May.
- Personnel We have a full staff at the moment.
- Fire Hydrants An updated report was distributed. Almost all of the hydrants have been flushed and tested. We are repairing them as we go, if needed. We hope to have all the hydrants completed in a few weeks. All hydrants will be flushed and the gears greased annually.
- New truck We are searching for a compact truck replacement. We have \$40,000 budgeted but prices have skyrocketed. Mgr. Cahall and Supt. Pike plan to look at State bids to see what they can find and will report back to the Board next month.
- Water Usage Report Water usage was up due to flushing the hydrants and backwashing at the Plant. Treasurer S. Levermore asked about the water tower sensor. Steve is looking into it and we do not have an update. We will follow up with him and report back to the Board next month. Supt. Pike reported that grinder calls were up. The pumps are old and replacement parts are hard to find. We are repairing them with parts on hand and replacing the cores of those that cannot be repaired. The report was discussed by the Board and it was determined to eliminate the Summary of Operations page.

Old Business:

- The Board discussed the upcoming WRWSD plant tour for community members. It was determined to hold the event on Saturday, June 17th from 11am-2pm. The Board discussed what they would like the tour to include so residents can see how their money is being spent on upgrades. Please look for further announcements on Facebook, the WPOA website and the newsletter. Signs will be posted around the community as the date approaches.
- The WRWSD Bylaw revision was sent to Attorney Tom Mayes. Trustee Buskey and Secretary Wales met with Mayes and discussed a few suggestions he made. Buskey and Wales are finalizing the document and will send a final draft to Mayes and the Board to review. We hope to vote on a final resolution to adopt the updated bylaws in May. Once it is passed, a copy will be posted on the WPOA website.

New Business: None

Motions and Resolutions: Motion #2023-10 was made by Buskey and seconded by S. Levermore to authorize Mgr. Cahall to enter into a contract with Gullett, in an amount not to exceed \$120,000 from Sewer Reserves, to dredge the lagoon. A roll call vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.

Board Member Concerns: None

Executive Session:

- At 6:59pm, Wales made a motion and Buskey seconded to enter into Executive Session to discuss a personnel issue concerning staffing. A roll call vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.
- At 7:09pm, S. Levermore made a motion and Moore seconded to exit Executive Session. A roll call vote was taken and the
 motion passed unanimously.

Adjournment: The motion to adjourn was made by S. Levermore and seconded by Wales. A yea/nay vote was taken. All were in favor and the meeting was adjourned at 7:10pm.

WPOA Board of Trustees Annual Meeting – 04/15/2023

Vice President Ellis called the meeting to order at 7:30pm.

Roll Call: Present: Barton, Ellis, Marck, Raleigh, Taylor, Mgr. Cahall Absent: Moore (ex.). Crank and Holt were unexcused.

Others present: Trustee-elect Sue Eads and Rob Bynum

Election Officers present: Nan McHugh, Nominating Chair and Margi Borgman, Election Inspector

President's Report (Ellis):

- VP Ellis gave a special thank you to the Rules and Regulation Committee and the Election Committee for their hard work and time in revising our Covenants and conducting a special vote in September to update those Covenants. Thank you to our members who voted.
- VP Ellis thanked President Charlie Beard, the WPOA Board, WPOA Committees, Community Organizations, WPOA
 membership, volunteers, WPOA management and all of the WPOA employees for their dedication and commitment in
 making the following list of accomplishments possible.

Minutes: A List of Accomplishments for 2022 was read by Trustee Raleigh.

- 1. With 3 full time police officer we provided 7 day a week coverage with a daily average of 16 hours of coverage per day.
- 2. Updated the fire gate for better access.
- 3. Upgraded the web site enabling members to do the following remotely.
 - a. Pay annual dues and assessments
 - b. Renew guest cards
 - c. View their accounts
 - d. Pay fines and fees
 - e. Leave gate passes for their guests.
- 4. Recreation Center Upgrades
 - a. Replaced Alarm and camera system
 - b. Removed and replaced old showers with new tile showers
 - c. Replaced old lighting with new LED system in gym
 - d. Made repairs to the entrance of the Kiddy Pool
 - e. Sealed cracks in pickleball courts
 - f. Replaced 2 treadmills.
- 5. Lounge
 - a. Had the outside pressure washed
 - b. Grout repaired and sealed exterior
 - c. Repaired doors.
- 6. Lodge
 - a. Replaced siding with new metal siding

- b. Installed new stairway and landing to access attic
- c. Completed a rehab project after a flooding event caused by a broken pipe.
- d. Replaced air handling system.
- e. Installed new grease trap outside of lodge.

7. Campground

- a. Hired new campground manager
- b. Removed dead trees and branches
- c. Renumbered all campsites and installed reflective signs to make it easier for guest and emergency vehicles to find sites
- d. Had all drainage pipes cleaned and inspected
- e. Hired engineering firm to look at and to give recommendations on improving drainage.
- f. Replaced campground golf cart.

8. Lake and Dam

- a. Replaced docks at Hiawatha
- b. Replaced dock next to boat ramp
- c. Removed over 7,000 cubic yards of silt from the lake
- d. Stocked lake with Grass Carp and game fish
- e. Completed a \$150,000 repair to the spillway.
- f. Retrieved hundreds of cubic yards of sand that had washed away from the beach and put it back.
- g. Installed rock in ditches and shoreline for erosion control.

9. Roads

- a. Paved approximately 2 miles of roadway.
- b. Replaced 10 under road culverts
- c. Installed berms in curves where dangerous drop offs were.
- d. Ditched and cleared areas along the right of way for better visibility and drainage.
- e. Replaced damaged or outdated road signage.

10. Equipment purchases and upgrades

- a. GMC 3500 Truck
- b. Snow plow
- c. Salt Dogg salt spreader
- d. John Deere Excavator with trimming and ditching attachments
- e. Track loader
- f. New motors for dredging and security boats
- g. Built and outfitted a third dredging push boat.
- VP Ellis recognized President Charlie Beard's contributions to the WPOA Board as Vice President for one year and President for three years. He was a man of integrity and it was an honor to work alongside him. He also served several years on the WRWSD Board. Charlie was a member of the WaterSports Club and led several events that gave back to the community. One was the 5K Firecracker Run which donates proceeds to athletic scholarships for Eastern High School students. Trustee Barton presented his wife, Sandy Beard, with a plaque, his name plate and a gift card to Green Farms in Hillsboro. Sandy addressed the membership by saying that Charlie was a kind and humble man. He was a man of God, a family man and served the military, friends and his community. She thanked the Board for the gift card and plans to purchase a lilac bush and a cross for Destination Park, within Little Turtle, to place in his honor.
- VP Ellis recognized Trustee Holt for his service. A plaque and gift card will be given to him.

- At 7:44pm, Taylor motioned and Marck seconded to enter into Executive Session to elect WPOA Officers for the year 2023. A yea/nay vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.
- At 7:49pm, Barton motioned and Taylor seconded to exit Executive Session. A yea/nay vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.

WRWSD Board of Trustees Annual Meeting – 04/15/2023

President P. Levermore called the meeting to order at 7pm.

Roll Call: Present: Armstrong, Buskey, LaPlante, P. Levermore, S. Levermore, Wales and Mgr. Cahall

Absent: Moore (ex.)

Election Officers present: Margi Borgman, Election Inspector and Nan McHugh, Nominating Chair

President's Report (P. Levermore): President P. Levermore thanked management and all of our WRWSD employees for their hard work during 2022 to complete the list of following accomplishments.

Minutes: A motion was made by Buskey and seconded by Armstrong to approve the 3/27/23 minutes as read. A yea/nay vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.

- A list of WRWSD accomplishments for the 2022 year was read by President P. Levermore.
- 1. Hired an outside consultant to work with the Ohio EPA and perform a front to back inspection of the entire water/sewer plant to give recommendation for better performance and efficiencies. Based on these recommendations we completed the following:
 - a. Major upgrade to plant chemical treatment system adding automated chemical feed systems along with automated measuring/testing equipment.
 - b. Upgraded and or replaced lab equipment to meet any and all new EPA requirements
 - c. Updated all Lab operating procedures for more effective and efficient operation meeting all EPA requirements.
 - d. Ran underground power to the lagoon to enable the installation of a 24-hour sampler to continually test the water leaving the lagoon during drawdown.
 - e. Entered into a contract with a new class 3 water plant operator.
- 2. Completed the following maintenance and equipment upgrades.
 - a. Installed a new RFID gate system at the plant giving us the ability to better control entry to the plant and record all comings and goings at the plant.
 - b. Replaced water clarifier gear unit
 - c. Replaced first stage water filter materials
 - d. Installed underground electric to the backup lake.
