WPOA Board of Trustees Saturday Meeting – 6/8/2024

Any updates from the Friday email are indicated in **italics of the summary of each report.

President Taylor called the meeting to order at 10:00 am and led the attendees in the Lord's Prayer followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

Roll Call: Present: Bynum, Eads, Klein, Lane, Marck, Miller, Moore, Taylor, Mgr. Cahall Absent: Raleigh was excused.

Minutes: Miller made a motion and Klein seconded to approve the 5/11/24 WPOA Monthly minutes as printed in the newsletter. A yea/nay vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.

President's Report (Taylor): None

Treasurer's Report (Lane):

Operating funds

- May total operating income was \$229,000.
- May total operating expenses were \$300,000.00 with no unexpected expenses.
- Operating fund balance at the end of May was \$1,132,241.92.
- Operating income for the year at the end of May was \$1,903,000.00. That is 67% of the plan for 2024. Expected income at the end of May was 69% so 2% under budget.
- Operating expense for the year at the end of May was \$1,177,000.00. That is 40% of the plan for 2024. Expected expense at the end of May was 39% so 1% over budget.

Allocated Assessment Funds

- Income for allocated operating assessments in May was \$27,000.00.
- Assessment account expenditures in May totaled \$17,000.00 for Waynoka Drive culvert piping.
- Balance of all allocated assessment accounts at the end of May was \$1,572,044.17.

Invested Funds

Invested Reserves at the end of May totaled \$525,742.75.

Total cash on hand at the end of May was \$3,230,028.84.

Manager's Report (Paul Cahall):

- What a difference a year makes. Last year, we were all praying and doing rain dances to get enough rain to fill the lake until late July. This year we can't seem to get the rain to stop long enough to keep our yards mowed. The rain causes different issues but at least the lake is full.
- We have been finalizing plans with the repaving of Waynoka Dr. It looks like they will start work on the project in September after Labor Day and it will take around two weeks depending on the weather. Also, I had said they were going to be able to do both lanes at the same time. Unfortunately, some areas of Waynoka Dr are too wide to do that so they will be only doing one lane at a time. Looking on the bright side, this will help with traffic flow during the work.
- Code enforcement continues with boats being our focus right now. We have issued over 70 warning letters in the last month. If you receive one of these warning letters and have any questions or concerns, please contact me to discuss.
- We have seen a large reduction in algae and weeds this year over the last few years. This may be because we have had more rain and lower temperatures this spring than last year or because of the Carp we have put in over the last couple of years. We have our fingers crossed that we are close to a longer-term solution. Aqua Doc will continue to treat any areas that pop up on a weekly basis for the rest of the season.
- We have ordered the parts for the plumbing upgrades in the lodge and when they come in the work will begin. The lodge will be getting its own grinder system that will no longer be shared with the lounge. We are getting bids for the roof and foundation work on the lodge as well.
- Mgr. Cahall was asked to follow up on two member's questions from the last monthly meeting. The WPOA will not loan
 tables, chairs and tents to sanctioned club events that are on private property. The Board agreed to leave the policy as is,
 which is to allow sponsored clubs to borrow those items if the event is on WPOA property.
- The Hiawatha dock rocking is larger this year because the smaller rocks are easily washed away. We will try to create a path to the dock.

Motions & Resolutions: None

Community Organizations:

- Dave Adler is the new president of the club. Many members are transitioning away from the club and we are looking for new members. We sponsor many events and proceeds are given back to the community and surrounding area, such as, scholarships for local high school students. Please consider joining the club.
- David Wagner announced that Poker Run tickets, t-shirts and split the pot tickets will be on sale at the Marina from 4p-7p tonight. There will be other opportunities coming up to purchase tickets.

Board Comments and Concerns: None Membership Compliments and Concerns:

- Louis Mays The Garden Club had a successful container party. We have an upcoming boat tour for a group from
 Wilmington. On June 27th, we are hosting a native plant sale at Little Turtle starting at 7pm. Louis would like to see
 something done to control the deer population. He is concerned about spreading disease and safety issues that the deer
 present. Perhaps the ODNR has some suggestions and/or resources available.
- Ken Wagner seconded the deer population concern. Ken said the solar pickleball lights are inadequate and thinks it is a waste of money to purchase more. He has a website to share with appropriate lighting. President Taylor said the lights are in the long-range planning committee's plan but that does not mean they have been approved by the Board. Sue thanked Ken for his feedback about the lights. We have not received any since they were installed a few months ago.
- Tom Kizer Asked about dredging for the year. Mgr. Cahall said we are budgeted for three months of dredging this year which will begin near the end of the season in August and continue through October.
- David Palmer Would like to see the speeding cars addressed by perhaps lowering the speed to 25mph during the
 summer months. The baseball field has been tilled and is in the process of being cleaned up. He asked about the bases and
 chalkline marker. Mgr. Cahall said those belonged to the Russellville Knothole league and were returned to them when the
 shed was converted to sanctioned club storage. Trustee Klein said a group of residents are planning a workday at the field
 on Sunday at 10am. Please try to attend.

Adjournment: The motion to adjourn was made by Moore and seconded by Eads. A yea/nay vote was taken. All were in favor and the meeting was adjourned at 10:17am.

WRWSD Board of Trustees Saturday Meeting - 6/8/2024

Vice President Moore called the meeting to order at 9:30 am.

Roll Call: Present: Armstrong, Feil, Kost, Moore, Wales, Mgr. Cahall

Absent: Levermore,

Minutes: A motion was made by Armstrong and seconded by Wales to approve the 5/11/24 minutes as read and amended as follows: remove Supt. Pike's name from Roll Call and Mgr/Supt. Report and replace with Supt. Wilson's name. A yea/nay vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.

President's Report (Levermore):

- Vice President Moore thanked Jason Brumley and Scott Harper for submitting applications for the WRWSD trustee position. Congratulations to Scott Harper for his appointment.
- VP Moore read an excerpt from a special report received from the Ohio House of Representatives. "Congratulations to Lake Waynoka for receiving the Auditor of State Award for timely, accurate and comprehensive financial statements. This is a prestigious distinction which recognizes Lake Waynoka's WRWSD hard working employees and staff. On behalf of the WRWSD Board, thank you and congratulations on receiving this award.

Treasurer's Report (Feil): A motion was made to adjust the 2024 WRWSD expense budget. See below.

Manager and Plant Superintendent Report (Mgr. Cahall/Supt. Wilson):

- We are working with the WPOA to repair the plumbing at the Lodge.
- PFAS, is an acronym for permanent chemicals aka forever chemicals. We have two giant carbon filters that were installed several years ago. The filters keep those chemicals out of our water. We comply with daily testing for those chemicals which is mandated by the EPA.

Old Business: None New Business: None

Motions and Resolutions: Motion #2024-11 was made by Wales and seconded by Armstrong to amend the 2024 WRWSD budget increasing expenses by \$16,100 for increases to licenses, lab supplies, water meters and misc. charges. A roll call vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.

Adjournment: The motion to adjourn was made by Kost and seconded by Armstrong. A yea/nay vote was taken. All were in favor and the meeting was adjourned at 9:43am.

WRWSD Board of Trustees Meeting – 5/28/2024

President P. Levermore called the meeting to order at 6:00pm.

Roll Call: Present: Armstrong, Feil, Kost, Levermore, Moore, Wales, Mgr. Cahall, Supt. Pike Other present: Scott Harper

Minutes:

• A motion was made by Kost and seconded by Armstrong to approve the 5/11/24 monthly meeting minutes as distributed. A yea/nay vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.

President's Report (Levermore): President Levermore introduced Scott Harper as one of the applicants for the open WRWSD Trustee position. Jason Brumley also submitted an application. He sent his regrets that he could not attend this meeting. Levermore gave a general overview of the Board's responsibilities and gave Mr. Harper a chance to ask questions.

Treasurer's Report (Feil): The April 30th financial statement was submitted for review and approval (see Motions below).

Manager and Plant Superintendent Report (Mgr. Cahall/Supt. Pike):

- Lagoon aeration The dredging of the lagoon last year helped our PH levels through the fall. The PH levels are increasing this spring. Supt. Wilson is performing a root cause analysis to determine a long- term solution.
- Water leak We have fixed several leaks which has decreased our water loss. Supt. Wilson would like to get an estimate to have all the water lines in the community professionally tested for leaks. The Board agreed and Supt. Wilson will present the information at the next workshop.
- OSHA Training Supt. Wilson has created a binder to track OSHA employee compliance. The WRWSD staff is completing two modules per week.
- CCR Supt. Wilson has completed the consumer confidence report ahead of schedule.
- Sewer Expansion Update The request for qualifications from engineering firms is due by the end of June. The Board can discuss options at that time. The EPA will need to approve the plant design and we can inquire about direct discharge, at that time, although Supt. Wilson believes it will be denied.
- PFAS Update Supt. Wilson and Dan Pike attended a conference about PFAS chemicals. Our water is being tested daily and we are in compliance with the EPA mandate.
- Dan Training –Dan Pike continues to do training for additional certifications. Again, congratulations to Dan for obtaining his Class 1 Operator license.
- Office procedures The Board revisited the trial billing operations with Supt. Wilson. Mgr. Cahall said it has been helping the office staff immensely when Supt. Wilson returns the purchase order (PO) with the budgeted line-item number written on the PO. Supt. Wilson keeps his own spreadsheet with the codes and POs for quick reference. It was determined that Supt. Wilson does not need to open payments to the WRWSD. There are two employees reviewing invoices for accuracy.
- Supt. Wilson would like to explore installing a supplementary automatic system that communicates with Brown County Rural Water to control the water system when we can't keep up with production. He would also like to see the budgeted water tower measuring device purchased and installed so the staff can determine how many gallons we have in reserves. The Board asked him to get an estimate for the supplementary system.
- Vice President Moore asked Supt. Wilson to encourage the WRWSD staff to receive the Hepatitis B vaccine series to protect themselves. This vaccination is free of charge to WRWSD employees.

Old Business: The Board revisited a question from a property owner concerning the maximum number of homes the water and sewer plant will be designed to handle after the sewer plant expansion is completed. The design is targeted, at this point, to be around 1,750 homes. Currently, we have around 1,000 homes we are servicing.

New Business: Candidate Harper voluntarily left the room while the Board had a discussion on the two candidates for the open position. The Board then voted on the candidates with the Rules and Regs requirements for Vacancies being met. A motion was made to appoint Scott Harper. See below. Mr. Harper will be sworn in at the June 24th, 2024 workshop.

Motions and Resolutions:

- A motion was made by Kost and seconded by Moore to approve the April 30th financial statement as distributed. A yea/ nay vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.
- Motion #2024-09 was made by Wales and seconded by Moore to appoint Scott Harper as WRWSD Trustee with term expiring April 2027. A roll call vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.
- Motion #2024-10 was made by Wales and seconded by Kost to approve the following sentence to the WRWSD Rules and Regulations under Section 2.5 Vacancies. "Upon receipt of applications for the vacancy, the Nominating Committee shall have the responsibility of reviewing candidates' applications to verify eligibility." A roll call vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.

Board Member Concerns: None

Adjournment: A motion was made by Armstrong and seconded by Feil to adjourn the meeting. A yea/nay vote was taken. All were in favor and the meeting was adjourned at 7:00pm.

In honor of Jimmy Buffet, deck out your golf cart to honor one of his family friendly songs.


