WPOA Board of Trustees Saturday Meeting - 04/11/2026

***Any updates from the Friday email are indicated in **italics** of the summary of each report.*

***The deadline for submission of information for the monthly newsletter and other media releases is the Tuesday following the WPOA meeting at 4pm. The Office staff appreciates the cooperation of all of the clubs to share the events and activities held at Lake Waynoka.*

There are no approved Wpoa meeting minutes for April available for publication at this time. The previous Board Secretary resigned from the WPOA Board and did not provide the meeting minutes prior to departure.

Waynoka Property Owners Association (WPOA) Annual Meeting of the Membership April 18, 2026 – 7:30 p.m.

1. Call to Order

The Annual Meeting of the Waynoka Property Owners Association was called to order at **7:30 p.m.** by President Sue Eads.

2. Roll Call

3. President's Remarks

President Eads introduced the current WPOA Board of Trustees and provided a brief overview of the meeting agenda.

4. Purpose of the Annual Meeting

The President stated that the purpose of the Annual Meeting was to conduct required Association business, including the installation of Trustees elected by the membership and other business properly brought before the Association.

5. Motion to Enter Executive Session

At **7:35 p.m.**, Vice President Mike Bisbe made a motion, seconded by Trustee Ed Mulloy, for the Board to enter executive session to address a matter involving Board member conduct.

The motion passed unanimously, no one opposed. All board members entered executive session.

6. Motion to Exit Executive Session

At **7:55 p.m.**, Vice President Mike Bisbe made a motion, seconded by Treasurer Chris Lane, to exit executive session. Trustee Wagner did not return to his station at this time.

The motion passed unanimously by the trustees present.

7. Board Action Following Executive Session

Vice President Bisbe read a recommendation received from the Association's independent HR consultants. The written recommendation from the Association's independent HR consultant, concluded that removal was necessary to mitigate organizational risk.

Following the reading of the recommendation:

- Vice President Bisbe made a motion, seconded by Trustee Mulloy, to remove Trustee Wagner from the WPOA Board of Trustees.
- A roll call vote was conducted. (abstained: Trustee in subject matter)
- The motion **passed unanimously**, and Trustee Wagner was removed from the Board.

8. Trustee Resignation

Secretary Nancee Klein formally resigned from her position on the Board of Trustees.

9. Installation of Trustees / Oath of Office

Election Inspector Nan McHugh introduced newly elected Trustees Doris Kitchen and George Baker, along with returning Trustee Rob Bynum.

Ms. McHugh requested Trustee-elect George Baker to take his seat and thanked President Sue Eads for her service.

All Trustees then stood and renewed their Oath of Office. Ms. McHugh thanked the Trustees for their service and volunteer commitment to the community.

10. Motion to Enter Executive Session (Officer Elections)

At **8:05 p.m.**, Trustee Mike Bisbe made a motion, seconded by Trustee Chris Lane, to enter executive session for the purpose of electing WPOA Officers for 2026. Bisbe, Lane, Miller, Bynum, Kitchen, Baker entered executive session

The motion passed unanimously.

During executive session, Trustee Miller resigned his position on the Board.

11. Motion to Exit Executive Session

At **8:15 p.m.**, Trustee Lane made a motion, seconded by Trustee Bisbe, to exit executive session.

The motion passed unanimously by the remaining six board members.

12. Announcement of 2026 Officers

Election Inspector Nan McHugh announced the elected WPOA Officers for 2026:

13. Closing Remarks

President Bisbe thanked the Election Committee and former Trustees Klein, Miller, Wagner and Eads for their service to the community. He stated that the Board's actions were taken in reliance on the recommendation from an independent third party HR consulting firm and with consideration of the best interests of the Association.

14. Adjournment

A motion to adjourn was made by Trustee Lane and seconded by Trustee Bynum. The motion passed unanimously, and the meeting was adjourned at **8:20 p.m.**

WRWSD Board of Trustees Monday Meeting - 03/30/2026

President Levermore called the meeting to order at 9:30am.

Roll Call: Present: Dombroskie, Engle, Feil, Gruber, Levermore, Mgr. Wilkin

Absent: Armstrong and Harper were excused.

Minutes:

- A motion was made by Engle and seconded by Dombroskie to approve the 2/23/26 meeting minutes as distributed and read. A yea/nay vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.
- A motion was made by Feil and seconded by Dombroskie to amend the 2/14/26 minutes as follows: "Brown County Rural Water cannot provide water permanently to Lake Waynoka based on its commitment to Mt. Orab". The 2/14/26 minutes will strike the comment containing the "data center" as it was written in error. A yea/nay vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.

President's Report (Levermore): None

Treasurer's Report (Feil): Treasurer Feil has reviewed the February financials and found no issues.

Manager and Plant Superintendent Report (Mgr. Wilkin/Supt. Wilson):

- Over the last month, we have applied for \$11 million in grants to help pay for the water and sewer expansion.
- The EPA completed their annual inspection of the WRWSD plant and water distribution. They walked through the community and found 5 frost-free hydrants which then led to the discovery of missing backflow preventers in the campground. Absence of these preventers can allow water to become cross contaminated. As purveyors of water, the WRWSD must provide clean water for consumers. The Brown County Health Department (BCHD) determined that the water cannot be turned on to the campground until the backflow preventers are installed. We are following the guidance of the EPA and BCHD in fixing these issues.
- The lake is full. We will be opening the valve mid- April to drain the lagoon. This process should only take two weeks and minimal lake water drop is expected. We will not be able to drain the lagoon again until November.
- The EPA has approached us about direct discharge. I will be sharing more information with the Board at the next Monday meeting. It is by no means a done deal but we are trying to get there.

Old Business: None

New Business: None

Motions and Resolutions: A motion was made by Feil and seconded by Engle to approve the February 28 th financial statement as distributed. A yea/nay vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.

Board Member Concerns: Secretary Dombroskie announced an article in the Dayton Daily News detailing water rates of 150 communities. Based on this comparison, Lake Waynoka is 4 th to 5 th from the top when listing cheapest rates. President Levermore said the Ohio EPA also does a water and sewer rate study listing each community's prices for water and sewer rates.

Membership Concerns: None

Adjournment: The motion to adjourn was made by Engle and seconded by Feil. A yea/nay vote was taken. All were in favor and the meeting was adjourned at 9:55am.

WRWSD Board of Trustees Saturday Meeting – 4/11/26

President Levermore called the meeting to order at 9:30am.

Roll Call: Present: Armstrong, Dombroskie, Engle, Harper, Levermore, Mgr. Wilkin

Absent: Feil and Gruber were excused.

Minutes: A motion was made by Engle and seconded by Dombroskie to approve the 3/30/26 meeting minutes as distributed and read. *An amendment was made to correct an error in the Treasurer’s Report. An account was moved from Peoples Bank in Georgetown to Peoples Bank in Sardinia so Mgr. Wilkin can make daily deposits on his way home. It should also include that Kay Bundy was a 30+ year employee.* A yea/nay vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously, as amended.

President’s Report (Levermore): None

Treasurer’s Report (Feil): None

Manager and Plant Superintendent Report (Mgr. Wilkin/Supt. Wilson):

We opened the lake valve on April 6th to drain the lagoon. This will take approximately two weeks. It is a requirement of the EPA to dilute the lagoon water as it is released into the environment. We are unable to drain the lagoon again until November.

The Board gave the directive to discuss regionalization of the WRWSD wastewater plant. We have the potential for a project to come to fruition to benefit Lake Waynoka and Russellville by creating a regional wastewater system. This project would allow us to qualify for many grants and zero-interest loans that we would not be eligible for on our own. This partnership could offset costs and possibly allow us to incorporate direct discharge. We are in the early stages and in the process of creating a memorandum of understanding. It would be a metered system and charge based on the amount of water to be treated coming from Russellville. Currently, there is no commitment. We are in the beginning phase of discussions.

New Business: None

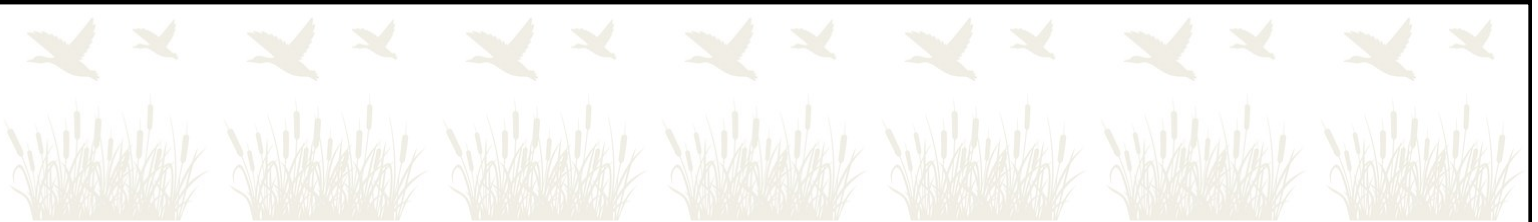
Motions and Resolutions: A motion was made by Harper and seconded by Engle to approve the March 31st financial statement as distributed. A yea/nay vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.

Board Member Concerns: None

Membership Concerns: Jeff Rush asked who would maintain and control the growth. We have the control to say we would only take on “x” amount of wastewater. The growth outside the lake would be legally limited by the WRWSD plant capacity.

Adjournment: The motion to adjourn was made by Engle and seconded by Harper. A yea/nay vote was taken. All were in favor and the meeting was adjourned at 9:55am.

WRWSD Annual Meeting Minutes 4/18/2026

President Pete Levermore called the meeting to order at 7pm.

Roll call: Present: Armstrong, Dombroskie, Engle, Gruber, Harper, Levermore, Mgr. Wilkin

Absent: Feil was excused.

President Report (Levermore): President Levermore gave a special thank you to the efforts of our WRWSD staff and read the following:

Major Accomplishments of April 2025 – March 2026

Thanks to the efforts and work of the WRWSD employees and management there have been a number of accomplishments in the past 12 months that have made positive impacts to our plant, its operation, and our infrastructure. These contribute toward our continued efforts to reliably and safely accommodate our growing community's processing of wastewater and providing of safe drinking water.

The WRWSD Board is pleased to remind you of some of these key accomplishments. They are:

- Obtained and maintained the Ohio EPA 2025 License to Operate (LTO) for the public water system, ensuring uninterrupted legal operation throughout the year.
- Completely and formally revised the 2025 Emergency Contingency Plan, including emergency response procedures, auxiliary power coverage, and public notification protocols.
- Completed and received Ohio EPA approval of a Source Water Assessment Report, updating the original 2003 assessment and refining protection area boundaries.
- Prepared and distributed the 2025 Consumer Confidence Report (CCR) in compliance with the Safe Drinking Water Act public notification requirements.
- Delivered a quality product and service (water and sewer) to the community and fixed various leaks and breaks throughout the year in a timely manner.
- Tank level monitoring SCADA system installed which electronically monitors and controls processes enabling alarm capability and remote supervision and data collection.
- Replaced eight (8) distribution system line valves and installed twelve (12) new fire hydrants with six (6) additional valves, improving system reliability and fire protection.
- Installed new sanitary sewer mains on Mule Drive, Stallion Drive, and Bonanza drive.
- Replaced the lake drain valve operator assembly.
- Installed a new duplex sewer grinder pump station serving the restaurant and lounge facilities, improving wastewater conveyance reliability.
- WTP -Replaced water plant main high service pump #2, restoring full pumping redundancy and reliability. Rebuilt low service raw water pump #2 to improve reliability of raw water delivery to the treatment process. GAC (granular activated carbon) filter media replaced.
- WWTP - Replaced the pre-air blower serving the odor control system, replaced the main gear for the outside oxidation ditch rotor, and installed new electric panels for the Return Activated Sludge (RAS) pumps.
- Investigated aeration alternatives to reduce midge population at the lagoon.
- Met with Brown County Regional Water (BCRW) authorities regarding future water service on an uninterrupted, long-term basis. (They would not commit to this.)
- Worked with OEPA to come up with possible solutions for our water manganese issue (water discoloration). Not yet resolved, but in process and hope to resolve by this year.
 - Researched and moved forward with DAF unit technology before establishing this did not meet budget constraints.
 - Switched to pursuing a second clarifier as an alternative as this addresses the issue and still falls within budget constraints.
- Applied for and received a \$250,000 grant and a \$250,000 interest free loan toward implementing the expected solution for the manganese issue.
- Had an engineer provide a capacity study of both water and sewer. This established that for both water and sewer we only have capacity left for about 150 additional homes before we would be at 100% capacity. (Community had been growing around 30 homes/year for last 8 years.)
- Increased fees for WRWSD permits to both slow growth until capacity issue is resolved, thereby minimizing risk to the community and to align with countywide septic system installation costs.
- Passed a resolution for a new fee structure going forward which allows for the plant expansion design, permitting, and construction required to expand capacity.
- Developed, implemented and revised a process to evaluate approvals for new home water and sewer connection permits.
- Have **applied** for additional grants, currently exceeding \$10 million worth, for the water and sewer plant expansion project. (No word yet on acceptance.)
- Evaluated 5 appeals requesting WRWSD permits after a temporary freeze was put on issuing WRWSD permits during Nov -Dec timeframe and approved 4 of those.

- Completed annual EPA and local Brown County Health Department inspections and made required corrections at the campground.
- Two WRWSD operators passed Class 1 and Class 4 Operator Exam for water.
- Observed 200,000-gallon monthly increase in water usage.
- Reduced system wide water loss to <15% (15% is an industry accepted standard).
- Audited 2025 Financial reports with no issues found.
- Received the 2023 Auditor of State award for WRWSD excellence in financial reporting.

Recognition of Service

President Levermore thanked Connie Armstrong for her years of service.

Oath of Office

Election Inspector Nan McHugh introduced newly elected WRWSD Trustee, Jason Brumley and continuing Trustee Bryan Gruber. They were elected by acclamation. All Trustees stood to renew their oath and commitment to the community. Nan thanked everyone for serving and volunteering their time for our community.

Executive session

- At 7:11pm, Dombroskie made a motion and Engle seconded to enter into executive session to elect WRWSD Officers for 2026. A roll call vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.
- At 7:16pm, Harper made a motion and Dombroskie seconded to exit executive session. A roll call vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.

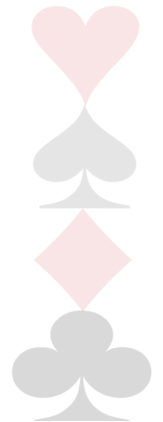

Please **DO NOT** open your water meter for any reason. If you feel there is a problem, please contact the WRWSD plant (937-446-3256).

Give your grinder pump air!

If you are going to landscape around your grinder pump, the grade around the pump should be a minimum of 4" below the top of the lid and sloped away from the unit.



Reduce Water Use

Save **2.5 gallons** of water per minute

While **shower water** warms up, catch it in a bucket and use it to water plants



Use a water efficient flush toilet.



Find and repair leaks.



Take a quick shower.

Convert to water and energy saving faucets.



Avoid wasting running water as possible.



Use an energy efficient washing machine.



Water plants during the coolest part of day.



Clean driveways and sidewalks with a broom instead of hose.

NO WAKE is defined as the lowest speed possible to maintain headway and navigation.

All coves and inlets in their entirety beginning at their entrance from the main lake are **NO WAKE** zones as well as within 50 feet of the Dam and all main lake shorelines.
