WPOA Board of Trustees Saturday Meeting - 07/11/2026

***Any updates from the Friday email are indicated in **italics** of the summary of each report.*

***The deadline for submission of information for the monthly newsletter and other media releases is the Tuesday following the WPOA meeting at 4pm. The Office staff appreciates the cooperation of all of the clubs to share the events and activities held at Lake Waynoka.*

- **Call to Order:** President Mike Bisbe called the meeting to order. The meeting was livestreamed, with AJ to post the recording Monday–Wednesday.
- **President’s Remarks —Mike Bisbe:** Recognition and thanks were given for the Sioux Cove fireworks and the farmers market.
- **Financial Report — Chris Lane:** Treasury and account balances were presented, including the general fund, CDs, capital, operating, and reserve accounts. The report reflects balances approximately 30 days in arrears to incorporate monthly adjustments and is not intended to represent a complete set of financial statements.
- **Employee & Member Recognition:**
 - Employee of the Month: Tina Taylor, approaching her 10-year anniversary.
 - Member of the Month: Don Barge, recognized for volunteer service on the Building/Code Committee.
- **Administration & Operations — Todd Wilkin:** Continued progress was reported on financial systems, operational efficiency, member services, compliance, and the livestreaming rollout. Community events and outreach continue to show positive momentum.
- **Facilities & Projects:**
 - Solar dock lights installed as a pilot — monitoring for light/efficiency impacts.
 - Angela’s expansion: in permitting with Brown County; projected completion mid–late August if permitting proceeds.
 - Back gate reliability: exploring interim fix adding an RFID reader to the second gate to mitigate failures; costing underway.
 - ACH implemented; thanks to AJ for effort.
 - Legal: Mike Napier matter ongoing; Cayman & Cousumano engaged and requested an extension.
 - Wake Boat Policy:
 - Approved prohibition on new wake boat acquisitions effective July 11, 2026.
 - Grandfather clause for existing wake boat owners as of effective date; existing owners issued a voucher and may replace their wake boat without forfeiture.
 - Voucher transfer allowed to descendants (with property ownership requirements discussed).
 - Forfeiture on permanent relocation; forfeited vouchers go to a waitlist (application + \$500 registration; \$500 voucher acquisition fee when offered; 48-hour acceptance window).
 - Wake boat definition: motorized vessel with manufactured dry weight ≥ 3,500 lbs and wake enhancing equipment (ballast tanks, bags, tabs, hydrofoils, etc.). Classification applies regardless of whether such equipment is deployed.
 - Rationale: stop growth of wake boats while recognizing existing owners; compromise to limit litigation/excess disruption.
 - Community Feedback: Questions and comments on property values, replacement rules, descendant transfers, lottery vs. waitlist, dock/wave damage (Pontiac Dock noted), and limits on simultaneous wake boat use. Board noted this is step one and may be refined.
- **Long-Range Planning — Greg Stover:** An overview was provided of the lake, improvement, and road assessment funds. Approximately 16 projects per fund are planned for 2026, representing roughly \$940,000 in planned expenditures. The full report is available on the website and will also be shared through segmented posts. A committee vacancy was announced.
- **Community Reports:** Updates included Civic Club activities, the veteran banner program, and a Quilts of Valor presentation honoring Senior Chief Franz Ott.
- **Other Business:**
 - Employee handbook revisions from People First were approved.
 - Yellow Book club/committee bylaw changes were adopted to standardize rules and reduce liability.
 - The Aqua doc contract will be competitively rebid at the end of its current term.

Adjournment: The meeting was adjourned.

- 6 permits were issued during June 2026.
- A total of 42 building permits have been issued year-to-date.
- Residential construction continues with 7 residence permits issued so far this year.
- Garage permits increased to 5 year-to-date, while deck permits reached 3 year-to-date and Dock/Boat Lift permits increased to 9 permits year-to-date .

Treasurer Report Month Ending June 2026

Operating Funds

June's total operating income was \$198,299.26.

June's total operating expenses were \$300,264.26, with no unexpected costs.

The operating fund balance at the end of June was \$1,261,522.49.

Operating income for the year at the end of June was \$2,273,300.16. That is 70% of the plan for 2026.

The expected income was 72% at the end of June, so 2% was under budget.

At the end of June, operating expenses for the year were \$1,554,539.31. That is 49% of the plan for 2026. The expected expense at the end of June was 49%, so on budget.

Allocated Assessment Funds

The income for allocated operating assessments in June was \$11,562.25.

Assessment account expenditures in June totaled \$38726.93.

The balance of all allocated assessment accounts at the end of June was \$895,495.03.

Invested Funds

Invested Reserves at the end of May totaled \$549,818.01.

Total cash on hand at the end of May was \$2,836,115.43.

WRWSD Board of Trustees Saturday Meeting - 07/11/2026

President Levermore called the meeting to order at 9:30am.

Roll Call: Present: Dombroskie, Engle, Feil, Gruber, Harper, Levermore, Mgr. Wilkin

Absent: Brumley was excused.

Minutes: A motion was made by Engle and seconded by Gruber to approve the 6/29/26 minutes as read and distributed. A yea/nay vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.

President's Report (Levermore): We met with Brown County Rural Water (BCRW) last year to see if they would provide water to us on a full-time basis. We were told no. We have another meeting scheduled with them this week to see if they have changed their mind. More information to come.

Treasurer's Report (Feil): None

Manager and Plant Superintendent Report (Mgr. Wilkin/Supt. Wilson):

- ACH payment option is up and running. Announcements were posted on Facebook and in an email blast. You can still pay with a credit/debit card (with a 3% service fee) or in cash at the WPOA Office. Of note, you must pay all of your WRWSD invoice. You can no longer select which portion to pay.
- Thank you to Greg Wilson and Dan Pike for hosting the WRWSD plant tour. It was well received by members. Attendees got to see firsthand the knowledge of our staff and the lack of upgrades over the past 50 years that require us to renovate and expand the plant.
- We are currently on BCRW supply. Last weekend, during the 4th of July, BCRW contacted us and asked us to cut the water supply to Lake Waynoka residents in half. We continue to face obstacles coming to an agreement with BCRW to provide water on a full-time basis. Another obstacle we are facing is that we were told by the EPA we are one-year out from a DAF tank or second clarifier approval to help us treat manganese which is contributing to water discoloration and water odor. We told the EPA that this is an emergency issue. They said it is not an emergency and clean drinking water can be discolored and have odors without being a health hazard. On June 18th we met with the EPA and they asked that we try to come to an agreement with BCRW for guaranteed water service. We explained that we have tried many times to regionalize with them. Trustee Gruber also spoke with BCRW and they said they do not have enough water supply to accommodate us. The EPA asked us to try again. We have a meeting scheduled with BCRW on July 13th. In the interim, we have reached out to Highland County water to ask if they could provide our water on a permanent basis since there is a main supply line off 32. Unfortunately, the main is 2" and there would need to be an 8" main to service our community. Highland County said they would provide us an estimate. BCRW daily capacity is about 3.7 million gallons per day. We hope to know better after this follow-up meeting with BCRW on July 13 whether they can reliably accommodate our community's needs. Our present plant can only treat an average of 125,000 gallons/day, due to its age. It was originally designed for more than that. We are looking for a design plant capacity of 500,000 gallons/day to cover future growth, unless we can get this from another source. A second water tower will be needed regardless of where our water comes from. To be clear, if any agreement is reached by BCRW or Highland County, water would only be provided to the water main just inside the lake. WRWSD would be responsible for all water related infrastructure within Lake Waynoka such as water pipes. We will need to come up with a long-range plan for replacing the 50-year-old pipes. There are many moving parts. Be assured that we are looking at all options and are transparent with the hurdles we are facing. We will provide more information as we receive it.

Motions and Resolutions: A motion was made by Engle and seconded by Gruber to approve the June 30th financial statement as distributed. A yea/nay vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.

Adjournment: The motion to adjourn was made by Harper and seconded by Feil. A yea/nay vote was taken. All were in favor and the meeting was adjourned at 9:54am.

WRWSD Board of Trustees Monday Meeting - 06/29/2026

President Levermore called the meeting to order at 6:00pm.

Roll Call: Present: Brumley, Dombroskie, Engle, Feil, Harper, Levermore, Mgr. Wilkin, Supt. Wilson

Absent: Gruber was excused.

Minutes:

- A motion was made by Engle and seconded by Dombroskie to approve the 5/26/26 minutes as distributed. A yea/nay vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.
- A motion was made by Harper and seconded by Engle to approve the 6/13/26 minutes as distributed. A yea/nay vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.

President's Report (Levermore): None

Treasurer's Report (Feil): Three motions were made. One was to approve the preliminary 2027 WRWSD budget as required by State law. The second was to adjust the 2026 budget to cover the BCRW water expense invoice. The third was to approve the May 31st financial statement.

Manager and Plant Superintendent Report (Mgr. Wilkin/Supt. Wilson):

- Supt. Wilson will confirm if the BCRW billing cycle is 4 or 6 weeks.
- Supt. Wilson presented a production detail graph for raw water conditions and sewer plant operations.
- We had 14 grinder pump calls and they were logged into the QR system.
- We saved money by hauling off sludge to Rumpke.
- We need to replace the GAC filter medium. It is filled with manganese and affected the taste and odor of our water. Mgr. Wilkin suggested using the logging revenue to help pay for the medium purchase. We have switched to BCRW in the interim. It was decided to wait until the results of the July 13 meeting (see next bullet) with BCRW are known before spending these funds.
- We had a meeting with OEPA on June 18. In that meeting, they requested we meet with BCRW again to see if they will revisit their previous position about permanently accommodating our water needs. Based on that request, a meeting with BCRW has been scheduled on July 13th. More information to come.
- The Board discussed creating a long-range planning committee for the WRWSD. Supt. Wilson has created a 12-year capital plan which can be easily updated.
- The Board discussed the issue of comparing water and sewer rates to surrounding communities. Providing safe drinking water is our highest priority. Our rates will reflect our commitment to provide quality services to the community and will not be based on other municipalities.

Old Business: None

New Business:

- Mgr. Wilkin received an email last week that was copied to a WPOA Trustee. Mgr. Wilkin would like to make it clear that the WRWSD is a separate entity from the WPOA and they are not linked in any way.
- Vice President Engle reminded Trustees to look for educational links in their Lake Waynoka emails. He will provide information on how to receive alerts of new emails on your mobile device. Please set-up Google Drive for important WRWSD information.
- The Board discussed recording future WRWSD meetings. The two monthly WRWSD meetings are open to the membership as required by State law, therefore, we do not see the need to record them at this time.
- Mgr. Wilkin and AJ are still working on the ACH payment option. More information to come.

Motions and Resolutions:

- A motion was made by Harper and seconded by Engle to approve the May 31st financial statement as distributed. A yea/nay vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.
- Motion # 2026-14 was made by Feil and seconded by Harper to approve the attached 2027 budget, with total income of \$2,347,170.00 and total expenses of \$1,897,612.00. A roll call vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.
- Motion # 2026-15 was made by Feil and seconded by Engle to amend the 2026 budget as follows. Account #111-48 Purchase water from BCRW. Budgeted amount was \$55,000.00, amended amount \$105,000.00 with a difference of \$50,000.00. Total expenses budgeted amount \$1,986,612.00, budget amendment \$2,036,612.00 with a difference of \$50,000.00. A roll call vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.

Board Member Concerns: The Board discussed a concern from campers about water notifications since they do not receive a billing statement. We will discuss proposed solutions at the next workshop.

Adjournment: The motion to adjourn was made by Engle and seconded by Harper. A yea/nay vote was taken. All were in favor and the meeting was adjourned at 7:35pm.

Ingredients:

Firecracker Red, White and Blue Cake

1 box Betty Crocker™ Super Moist™ White Cake Mix

Water, vegetable oil and whole eggs called for on cake mix box

1 1/4 teaspoons red gel food color from 1 box Betty Crocker™ Classic Gel Food Color

1 1/4 teaspoons blue gel food color from 1 box Betty Crocker™ Classic Gel Food Color

1/2 cup from 1 tub (16 oz) Betty Crocker™ Rich & Creamy Vanilla Frosting

2 teaspoons Betty Crocker™ Red, White & Blue Sprinkles, if desired

Instructions:

Heat oven to 350°F. Generously spray 12-cup fluted tube cake pan with baking spray with flour.

In large bowl, beat cake mix, water, oil and whole eggs with electric mixer on medium speed 2 minutes, scraping bowl occasionally. In small bowl, place 1 cup of the batter; stir in 1 teaspoon of the red food color until blended. In another small bowl, place 1 cup of the batter; stir in 1 teaspoon of the blue food color until blended.

Pour red cake batter into bottom of pan. Carefully pour remaining white batter over red batter in pan. Carefully pour blue batter over white batter. (Blue batter does not need to cover white batter completely; it looks better if it just forms a ring in the center of the white batter.)

Bake 39 to 44 minutes or until toothpick inserted in center comes out clean. Remove cake from oven. Let stand 10 minutes, remove from pan to cooling rack. Cool completely, about 1 hour.

Place cake on cooling rack over waxed paper or cooking parchment paper. In small microwavable bowl, place 1/4 cup of the frosting. Microwave uncovered on High 10 to 15 seconds or until thin enough to drizzle over cake. With spoon, drizzle warmed frosting back and forth over cake in striping pattern. Divide remaining frosting between 2 small microwavable bowls. To 1 bowl, stir in 1/4 teaspoon red food color until well blended. Microwave uncovered on High 5 to 10 seconds or until thin enough to drizzle. Drizzle over cake. Repeat with remaining bowl of frosting and 1/4 teaspoon blue food color. Sprinkle candy sprinkles on top. Let stand about 30 minutes or until frosting is set. Store loosely covered at room temperature.

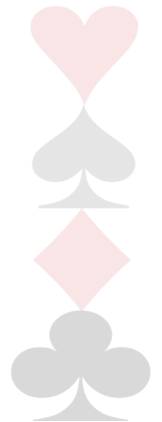
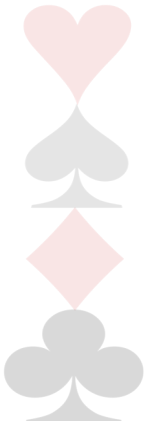

If you are going to landscape around your grinder pump, the grade around the pump should be a minimum of 4" below the top of the lid and sloped away from the unit.



Reduce Water Use

Save **2.5 gallons** of water per minute

While **shower water** warms up, catch it in a bucket and use it to water plants



Use a water efficient flush toilet.



Find and repair leaks.



Take a quick shower.

Convert to water and energy saving faucets.

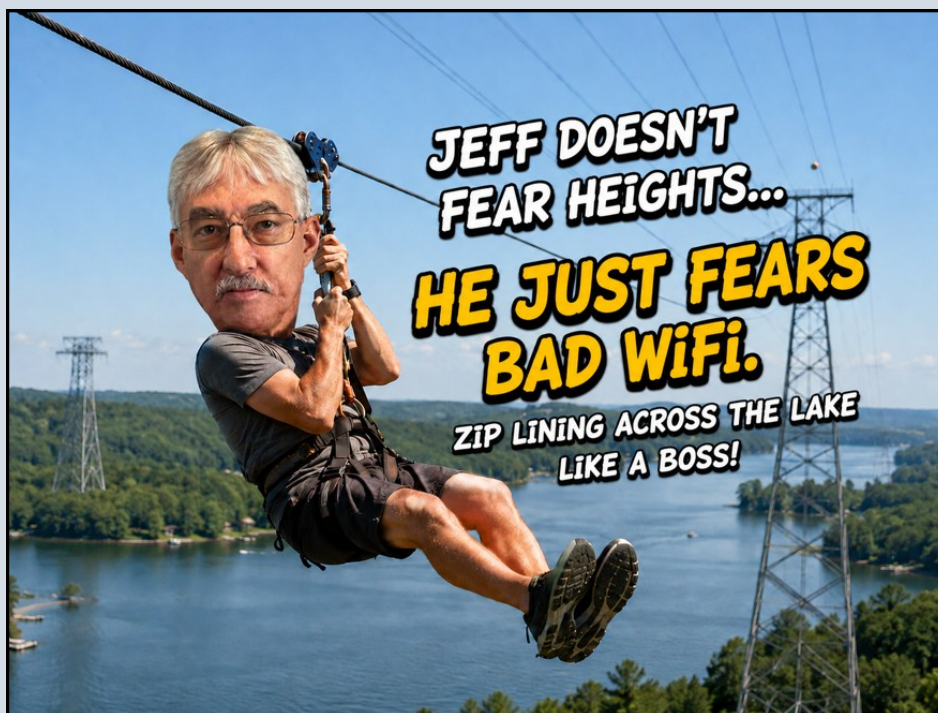

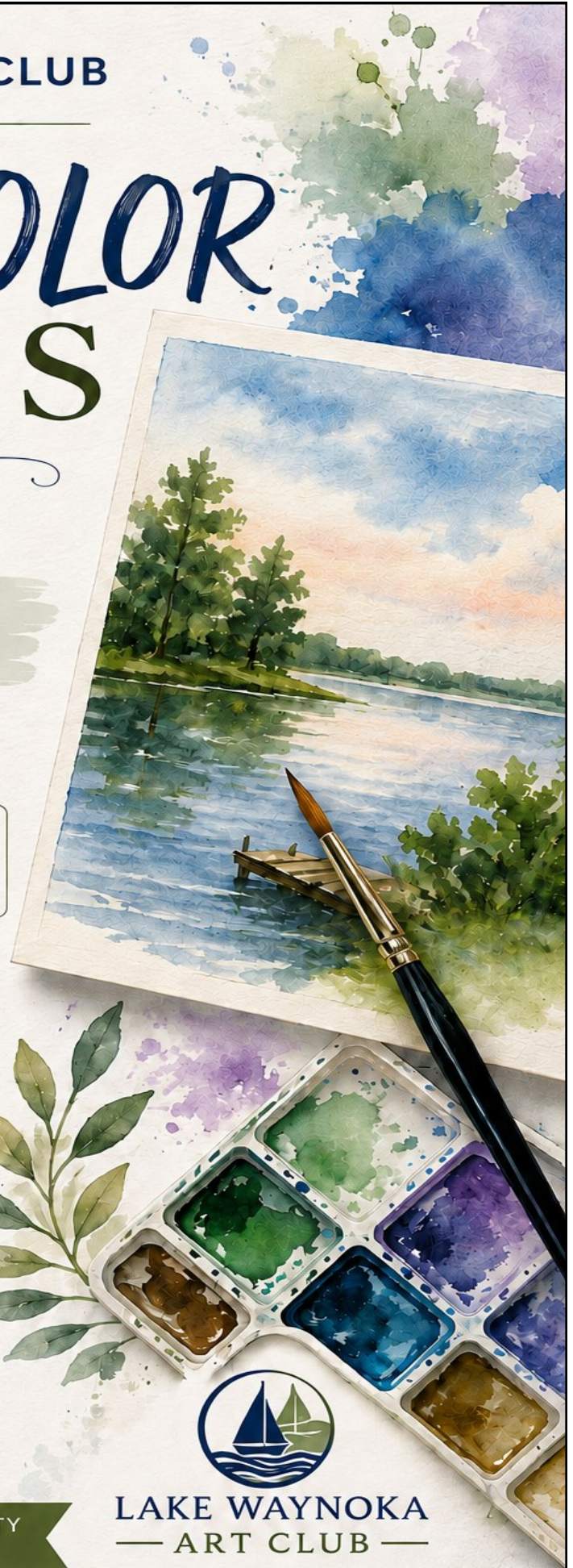
